# **Espoo Convention on EIA** in a Transboundary Context



# 4<sup>th</sup> Biannual Financial Report (period between 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> meetings of the Parties)

### Introduction

The Meeting of the Parties to the Espoo Convention (the Convention on Environmental Impact Assessment in a Transboundary Context, adopted in Espoo, Finland) requested "the secretariat, in accordance with the financial rules of the United Nations, to monitor the expenditure of the funds and to prepare a report for the next meeting of the Parties, including information on how much Parties and other participating States contributed to the budget of the Convention in cash and in kind, and on how the contributions were spent" (decision III/10, para. 10).

A small group, comprising representatives of Bulgaria, Switzerland and the United Kingdom, was formed by the Convention's Bureau to prepare an informal paper on financing. That informal paper was presented to the Working Group on Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) at its eighth meeting, 27-29 April 2005. The Working Group welcomed the informal paper and decided, *inter alia*, that the secretariat would report on income and expenditure on a six-monthly basis to the Bureau.

This document is the **fourth** such report and it updates the first three reports, which were prepared for the periods to 30 June 2005, 31 December 2005 and 30 June 2006.

The details of income and expenditure are presented in Tables 2 to 6. Table 1 provides a summary of income and expenditure and presents some of the consequences of the expected shortfall against the budget. Table 3 *bis* was added to the second report (and is included in this report) at the request of the Bureau to provide a further breakdown of meeting costs.

# **Summary**

This document provides a narrative description of Table 1, the summary table.

The total budget for activities under the workplan, in the period between the third and fourth meetings of the Parties, is US\$ 1,312,000. The activities were assigned priorities of 1, 2 or 3 (see Table 6), with the budgets for the priorities being:

Parties have made 'cash' contributions to the Espoo Trust Fund (Table 5), either fulfilling pledges made at the third meeting of the Parties, or in response to later appeals by the secretariat (Table 2). The only outstanding pledges for the period 2004-2007 are from Canada (Can\$ 4,000) and Slovenia (US\$ 3,000). Cash contributions to date, net of the UN programme support costs (see box, as requested by the Bureau), total US\$ 674,767. However, some contributors have imposed conditions on their contributions, including US\$ 78,081 earmarked for priority 2 activities.

### **Box: Programme support costs**

The UN Department of Economic and Social Affairs provides the following comment on programme support costs (UN intranet, at <a href="http://iseek.un.org/webpgdept5">http://iseek.un.org/webpgdept5</a> 18.asp?dept=5#6, accessed 6 January 2006):

"In their solicitation of funds from donors, the respective substantive Divisions should inform donors that reimbursement for programme support costs shall be provided for in respect of all activities financed from trust funds. The amount of the reimbursement shall be calculated at the standard percentage rate approved by the General Assembly. Currently, the standard percentage rate is calculated as 13 per cent of the incurred expenditures in accordance with resolution 35/217 [available at <a href="http://www.un.org/documents/ga/res/35/a35r217e.pdf">http://www.un.org/documents/ga/res/35/a35r217e.pdf</a>], Part V, in which the General Assembly [at its 1980 session]:

- (a) took note of the report of [Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions] on agency support costs (A/35/544); and
- (b) approved the reimbursement formula embodied in decision 80/44 of the then Governing Council of UNDP. The procedure regarding programme support costs is contained in administrative instructions ST/SGB/188, part IV, paragraph 39, and ST/AI/286."

To date, US\$ 327,951 has been spent from the Espoo Trust Fund (Table 3, with further details in Table 3 *bis*). The funds have been spent on three priority 1 activities (the second meeting of the Signatories to the Protocol on Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA), two meetings of the Working Group on EIA and five meetings of the Implementation Committee); on five priority 2 activities (three free-standing meetings of the Bureau, secretariat travel in relation to the workplan, an external expert to provide secretariat support, SEA capacity-building needs analysis, and capacity development in SEA, including creation of a capacity development

manual); and two priority 3 activities (a consultant to translate completed questionnaires and further secretariat travel in relation to the workplan):

Parties and organizations have also undertaken priority 2 workplan activities by providing inkind contributions (Table 4). These activities have been valued according to the budget indicated by the Meeting of the Parties. The activities were: two workshops for the exchange of best practice, five workshops for subregional cooperation, transboundary EIA capacity-building in EECCAA<sup>1</sup> countries and others, addressing institutional and procedural activities for the Protocol, SEA capacity-building needs analysis, and capacity development in SEA, including creation of a capacity development manual. The in-kind contributions to date have been valued at US\$ 252,000:

Ukraine's pledge to host a workshop for transboundary EIA capacity building, with confirmed support from Switzerland; (c) Armenia's pledge to host a workshop for transboundary EIA capacity building, again with confirmed support from Switzerland; and (d) Switzerland's expected support of training in transboundary EIA in Tajikistan.)

Finally, an expected final shortfall in the budget may be estimated from the current shortfall less the outstanding pledges to the Espoo Trust Fund and the outstanding in-kind contributions:

This expected shortfall has consequences for the different priority activities, as discussed below.

## Priority 1 activities

All priority 1 activities should be funded and completed. Extra meetings of the Implementation Committee, now foreseen because of the extended intersessional period, should also be funded.

# **Priority 2 activities**

The shortfall for priority 2 activities may be covered in part by finding sponsors for the fourth meeting of the Parties (including host government support), new contributions (in-kind or to the Espoo Trust Fund) and savings in undertaking activities, thus allowing the following priority 2 activities to be covered by the Espoo Trust Fund (with the subregional workshop for the Mediterranean and the workshops in Armenia and Ukraine having earmarked funds/pledges, and some other activities having been completed):

- Bureau meetings (free-standing, including extra meetings not foreseen in the workplan and budget)
- External expert to provide secretariat support
- Further secretariat support secretariat travel in relation to the workplan
- Workshops for the exchange of good practices in transboundary EIA
- Transboundary EIA capacity-building in the EECCA countries, and others workshops in Armenia and Ukraine
- SEA capacity-building needs analysis action plans
- Capacity development in SEA, including creation of a capacity development manual: finalization of manual

However, the following priority 2 activity is unlikely to receive funds from the Espoo Trust Fund:

• Further secretariat support – promotional materials (US\$ 10,000)

## **Priority 3 activities**

Three priority 3 activities are likely to proceed: the first as it is expected to be included within a larger Swiss-funded capacity-building activity; the second as there is now to be no cost for the Espoo Trust Fund; the third because of the extended intersessional period:

- Training course in Tajikistan (US\$ 60,000)
- Examination of the substantive relationship between the Convention and the Protocol (US\$ 15,000)
- Further secretariat support secretariat travel in relation to the workplan (US\$ 20,000)

However, the expected shortfall against the budget would probably mean that the following priority 3 activities would not receive funds through the Espoo Trust Fund, though bilateral donors might be identified. These activities are:

- Further secretariat support consultants (US\$ 60,000, except US\$ 2,000 used to cover translation of completed questionnaires)
- Further secretariat support promotional materials (US\$ 20,000)
- Promotion of contacts with countries outside the UNECE region (US\$ 25,000)
- Distribution of a relevant Russian-language journal (*Environmental Expertise and EIA*, published by ECOTERRA, US\$ 51,000)

ECOTERRA has been seeking donor funds for direct support of the journal.

# Observations on the financial reporting arrangements

The secretariat has the following observations on the financial reporting arrangements:

- 1. There are numerous inconsistencies between the table of pledges in the report of the third meeting of the Parties (ECE/MP.EIA/6), the workplan table (annex IX) and the budget table (annex X). These include contributions to the Espoo Trust Fund earmarked for activities having no budget (subregional cooperation hence the correction in line (f) of Table 1), earmarked contributions exceeding the activity budget (compliance with and implementation of the Convention), and earmarked contributions to priority 2 activities when funds are insufficient for priority 1 activities. These inconsistencies persist in the financial report.
- 2. If no budget was expressed in the budget table (annex X), the real value of work contributed to an activity has not been reflected in the financial report (see 'Value' column of Table 4).
- 3. There is no consideration of fund-raising, only reporting of received income and expenditure.
- 4. Savings on activities (actual cost against budgeted cost) have not yet been reflected in the financial report.
