Glossary, abbreviations, legends and units of measurement

Glossary:

Agricultural area: This category is the sum of areas under (a) arable land; (b)

permanent crops; and (c) permanent meadows and pastures.

Arable land: Arable land is the land under temporary agricultural crops

(multiple-cropped areas are counted only once), temporary meadows for mowing or pasture, land under market and kitchen gardens and land temporarily fallow (less than five years). The abandoned land resulting from shifting cultivation is not included in this category. Data for "Arable land" are not meant to indicate the amount of land that is potentially

cultivable.

Erosion: Erosion is the process by which soil is removed from the

Earth's surface by exogenous processes such as wind or water flow, and then transported and deposited in other locations. Water and wind erosion is measured as net loss of soil (in

tons per hectare or km² per year).

Permanent crops: Crops are divided into temporary and permanent crops.

Permanent crops are sown or planted once, and then occupy the land for some years and need not be replanted after each annual harvest, such as cocoa, coffee and rubber. This category includes flowering shrubs, fruit trees, nut trees and

vines, but excludes trees grown for wood or timber.

Permanent meadows and pastures: Permanent meadows and pastures is the land used

permanently (five years or more) to grow herbaceous forage crops, either cultivated or growing wild (wild prairie or

grazing land).

Water erosion: Washout or runoff of soil or rocks caused by water flows.

Wind erosion: Destruction and removal of soil or rocks caused by wind.
