and adolescents (the service is active since 2003) - The Department for Equal Opportunities participates to a project, financed by the European Commission, titled "Development of a specific method to identify and support children who have been sexually exploited for the production of child pornography images". The main aim of this project is increasing knowledge and skills of professionals working on the fight against child pornography and the protection of victims, through the development of a multidisciplinary intervention model to standardize the operational procedures necessary to identify and provide assistance to the victim depicted in child pornography material. The partners of the Project are: the Observatory for the Fight against Pedophilia and Child Pornography (Department for Equal Opportunities - Presidency of the Council of Ministers), Save the Children Italy, Ministry of Interior -Postal and Communication Police - and the Italian Coordination of Public and Private Services against Child Abuse (CISMAI). - The Department

for Equal Opportunities, through the

Observatory for the fight against pedophilia and child pornography, participates to the Advisory Board of the Safer Internet Center, which is composed of about 50 organizations including institutions, scientific societies, media, ICT and mobile phone industries, associations and universities working for the online protection of children and adolescents.

- Every year the Department for Equal Opportunities organizes the socalled "Week against Violence", as introduced in 2009, by a Memorandum of Understanding between the Department for Equal Opportunities and the Ministry of Education, University, and Research. During this Week which usually takes place in October, the Italian schools organize ad hoc awareness-raising and training activities on the prevention of violence, both physical and psychological, against women and based on any forms of discrimination. In the course of this Week, schools principals may plan lessons on violence, in which Carabinieri, State Police and relevant associations, participate. For the year 2011, the "Week against Violence" involved

	Through the ratification of the Council of Europe Convention on the protection of children against sexual exploitation and sexual abuse, new offenses has been introduced in the Criminal Code, such as solicitation of a minor and incitement to practice pedophilia and child pornography, the penalties for certain sexual crimes against children of particular gravity have been increased. Furthermore, a specific definition of child pornography has been introduced in the Criminal Code.
	Since 2009, every years a significant number of schools (about 110 schools in the last edition in 2011), are involved in the "Week against Violence".

Through the official launch of the Council of Europe campaign "One in five", the Italian Government contributed to support the process of signature and ratification of the Council of Europe Convention on the protection of minors against sexual abuse and exploitation (Lanzarote Convention) and to raise awareness of this phenomenon. Publication of a manual describing a multidisciplinary intervention model to standardize the operational procedures necessary to identify and provide assistance to the children depicted in child pornography Financing of assistance projects for child victims of sexual abuse and exploitation that are characterized by a strong appetite for creating a connection between all the institutional and operative resources at the local level. Publication of a "Strategic Agenda", a policy paper drafted by the Advisory Board of the Safer Internet Center, which is composed of about 50 organizations including institutions, scientific societies, media, ICT and mobile phone industries, associations and universities working for the online protection of children and adolescents. As regards the Emergency number 114, during the period may 2010 – april 2011, this Service managed 1574 emergency cases involving children and adolescences. These cases came in particolar from Regions Lombardia, Lazio and Campania. Most of the minors involved were under the age of 10. One in five had foreign nationality. In almost 70% of calls to the emergency situation has occurred at home and the parents resulted the main perpetrators. In about 40% of cases the situations involved abuses and violence: this category includes both forms of violence to which the child is the direct victim (psychological abuse, physical abuse, illness care, sexual abuse), and situations of violence / conflicts between members of the family of which the child / adolescent is witness.
