Answer:

Norway has a comprehensive education and vocational training system – policy, programmes and strategies - that targets all population groups from the age of 1. Public provisions of high quality are available in all parts of the country. Thus, the vast majority of students (90 - 98%) are enrolled in public schools, even if there are a few private alternatives. Public education and training at all levels, including higher/tertiary education, is delivered free of charge.

Except for the pre-school / ECCE provision, the various provisions are organized according to education level, not age.. Whereas the three levels that jointly constitute what is considered "Basic Education", i.e. Primary (7 years), Lower/Junior Secondary (3), and Upper/Senior Secondary (3), normally cater for the age group 6-19, they are in principle open to all age groups, according to needs. Primary and Lower Secondary education is compulsory, and attendance is 99-100%. In addition, all young people are *legally entitled* to three years of Upper Secondary general or vocational education and training. 95-98% of all youth that complete compulsory education (Lower Secondary), enrol in Upper Secondary. Of these, around 50% choose vocational education and training.

The comprehensive, public provision has been in place for decades. Reforms and adjustments in the various parts of the system are frequently considered and implemented, according to needs due to changing environments (technologies, markets, labour market, production structure etc).

Answer:

The Norwegian education system is gender sensitive. Boys and girls have identical rights. Girls are in majority at all levels of education, including higher education.

Reproductive health, sexual education and other major life skills are being delivered as compulsory issues in compulsory school.

All schools have separate toilet facilities for boys and girls.

Physical security outside the school area is a general public responsibility. There are antibullying programmes and conflict resolution programmes offered in most schools, according to needs.

There is practically no drop-out from compulsory school. In Upper Secondary school, some 31% of the students drop out of the programme they enrolled in, before completion. Some of these leave for a period and come back later to complete - second chance programmes are available. The Ministry is currently implementing two strategies in order to reduce the drop-out: "Tidlig innsats" (Early Efforts) and "Ny giv" (New Deal).

Cooperation with the social partner organizations in the world of work, i.e. employer organizations and trade unions, including teacher organizations, is the backbone of Norwegian vocational education and training (VET), and has been for decades. The Ministry of Education and Research, as well as the national Directorate for Education and Training, have regular and close contact with these actors in what is known as the tripartite collaboration. The social partners are involved in all parts of VET, from policy formulation, to curriculum development, training delivery and examination.

In other parts of education, the Ministry of Education and Research and the Directorate for Education and Training have regular contact with all interested parties, including religious groups and youth and students organizations, in order to ensure that their interests are considered in policy formulation and in the education content.

Answer:

Norway has for many years contributed some 1% of GDI to International Development. Most of the support to education is provided through multilateral agencies and mechanisms, such as UNICEF, UNESCO, FTI/GPE and the World Bank. Around 20% of the total support is provided bilaterally, mostly as budget support to the Government, and not with fixed amounts earmarked for specified sectors. Technical Assistance is in general not provided bilaterally by the Norwegian Government. All Norwegian support to International Development is channeled through the Norwegian Ministry of Foreign Affairs.
