COUNTRY QUESTIONNAIRE

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Brief summary of Global Survey completion process: After the accession to the European Union in May 2004, at the beginning of the second decade of the 21st century Poland faces serious demographic problems, such as low number of births, difficulties in the establishment and development of families, high mortality rates compared with Western European countries, shorter life expectancy than in the European Union, deficits in health status of the population, the real prospect of a large decrease in the number of inhabitants and a serious violation of the balance between generations. The continuity of generations is a critical issue to ensure a place for our nation and state in the modern world. The starting point for the demographic issue should be a conviction to respect human life. To support such systems of values, which increase the ethos of family and marriage in Polish society Demographic regeneration in Poland is necessary. It will be possible when conditions favoring establishing families and realizing reproductive plans will be created, including the combination of work and family responsibilities, as well as creating conditions favoring development of the young generation in families, as a factor to improve the quality of human capital (supporting families in bearing the costs of upbringing of the young generation), preventing social exclusion and dysfunctions in families. They should consider the changes taking place in today's society among the young generations - in their lifestyles, choices to be made, life priorities and, in general, the new patterns of life. In spite of the positive demographic change in recent years: a decrease in the mortality of infants, children and adolescents, extending the average duration of human life, they recognize the urgent need for planned remedial measures. An aging population should not be treated as a threat; it requires the understanding of adaptation processes to the demographic change, which has a global character. Population policy requires long-term actions by the state, which include acceptance and public support. The objectives of sustainable economic and social development, the "Europe 2050" strategy, "Europe 2020", the "Poland 2030" strategy, the "Poland 2050" report (by the Forecasting Committee, Poland 2000 plus) and "Millennium Goals for the Development of the United Nations" form the basic principles for the development of our country.

In the population structure according to national and ethnic identity. On the list of national and ethnic identities other than Polish the following groups can be distinguished: Silesian, Kashubian and German as the most numerous; others are significantly less numerous.

It is worth mentioning the issue of complex identity, particularly characteristic in the case of Silesian and Kashubian identity. People who declare Silesian identity, in many cases declared also Polish identity (415 thousand per 809 thousand declarations of Silesian identity). These relations appear in even clearer proportions in the case of Kashubian identity, where nearly all the Kashubians declared Polish identity, as well. It is extremely important information regarding the expectations of different population groups which concern the national and ethnic structure of our society.

Poland is a large country, which is spatially varying also with regards to the demographic situation. Numerous demographic processes and regularities are historically conditioned which is reflected in a different formation of the population development dynamics in particular regions

Additional maternity leave:

Introduction of the target length of the leave will take place in stages, until reaching in 2014 the final length of the maternal leave (respectively 6 and 8 weeks depending on the number of children at one birth). The additional leave may be taken also by the father of the child.

additional

maternity leave:

An employee can combine the use of additional leave maternity and work for an employer granting the leave. Work, however, cannot be done on a time basis higher than half of full-time work. Start of work occurs following a written request employee made no later than 7 days before the start of work. In the request the employee indicates the working time and the period which during he/she wants to use the additional maternity leave and work.

The employer has a duty to consider the request of the employee.

Paternity leave:

Since 2010 an employed father bringing up a child has the right to paternity leave. Since 2012, the length of such leave is 2 weeks, but not longer than until the child reaches 12 months of age or the expiry of 12 months from the effective date of validation of the decision on the

adoption and not longer than until the child is 7 years of age (or 10 years, in case of postponed compulsory schooling).

Child care leave:

An employee is entitled to child care leave of up to three years, but not longer than until the child is 4 years old.

Employee entitled to child care leave of up to three years (regardless of whether he/she used the aforementioned child care leave for children of up to 4 years of age), but not longer than until the child reaches the age of 18, if the child requires personal care because of health condition confirmed by the decision disability or severe disability.
