### **Brief summary of Global Survey completion process:**

The first step of the consultation process held in Serbia was to form the Serbia ICPD Beyond 2014 Working Group (WG) aiming to facilitate process of adjustment and finalization of the Global Survey Questionnaire (GSQ). In June/July 2012 representatives from the relevant ministries, NGOs and expert groups were in several occasions invited to suggest changes that will be incorporated in the final version of the GSQ. Based on their comments the final version of the GSQ was produced in mid August 2012.

At the beginning of the consultation process it was expected that the government representatives will take a lead in coordination of the ICPD Global Survey. However, due to political changes that occurred after the elections in May 2012; time that was needed for the negotiations about the new government and finally due to organizational reconstructions (both in terms of responsibilities of different ministries and staff changes), the role of the government in this process remained on relatively modest level.

ICDP Global Survey in Serbia was conducted from mid August to mid September 2012 and it involved 11 representatives from the relevant ministries, NGOs and experts. Draft version of the ICPD Beyond 2014 Review Report for Serbia was presented to the relevant stakeholders on 27 September 2012 and finale version of the report incorporated all outcomes from that meeting.

Identified weaknesses

Important limiting factor in data collection for this study is the fact that the May elections led to the dismissal of some of relevant persons who were in last four (4) years working on issues that are relevant to the ICDP Global Survey. Therefore some of interviewees:

- have just partial institutional memory necessary for understanding the changes that occurred in the past as well as the necessary information that would have given them an insight into the future priorities of the Government of the Republic of Serbia,
- do not know how to estimate the current level of implementation of different measures conducted either by some of relevant ministries, or by donor organizations,
- were not able to provide description of activities that have been implemented.

Being aware of this risk the ICDP Beyond 2014 Working Group has tried to select only interviewee with the first hand knowledge about ICDP issues, however the above listed limitations were best mirrored in what the newly elected Prime Minister Ivica Dacic said in his inauguration speech: 'This is not just a change of government as far as staff is concerned, it is also a change of concept'.
