Использование дневных ходовых огней

Записка секретариата

Прежде чем выяснить возможность определения общего европейского подхода к использованию дневных ходовых огней, WP.1 в ходе своей тридцать пятой сессии (3-6 октября 2000 года) сочла необходимым вначале ознакомиться с информацией о действующих национальных правилах, а также с результатами исследований, проведенных странами в этой области.

С этой целью летом 2001 года среди государств - членов ЕЭК ООН был распространен вопросник (*TRANS/WP.1/2001/39*), подготовленный делегацией Швейцарии в сотрудничестве с секретариатом. В ходе тридцать седьмой сессии WP.1 секретариат представил - в виде таблиц (*неофициальные документы 4, 4-бис и 4-тер сессии*) - результаты этого мероприятия на основе поступивших ответов (было получено 28 ответов) и проинформировал Рабочую группу о текущих изменениях на уровне Сообщества (см., в частности, сообщение от 11 июля 2001 года, принятое Европейской комиссией (СОМ(2001)389, окончательный вариант) и касающееся намерений автомобильной промышленности повысить уровень защиты пешеходов; среди предусмотренных мер в этом сообщении затрагивается и проблема дневных ходовых огней).

После представления этих материалов WP.1 поручила секретариату издать упомянутые выше неофициальные документы в виде официальных документов и решила вновь рассмотреть этот вопрос на своей следующей сессии, в частности в свете последних изменений, происшедших в автомобильной промышленности и на уровне ЕС.

Таковой, следовательно, является цель подготовки приведенных ниже приложений 1, 2 и 3, в которых воспроизводятся неофициальные документы, содержание которых все же было пересмотрено с целью отражения в них ответов на вопросник, который был недавно распространен среди государств-членов. Сейчас поступило в общей сложности 33 ответа. Из них следует, в частности, что немногим более трети стран, ответивших на вопросник - большинство из них расположены на севере Европы, - в обязательном порядке требуют постоянно использовать в дневное время на легковых транспортных средствах огни ближнего света или дневные ходовые огни. Требование об автоматическом включении огней в настоящее время не предусмотрено ни в одной из стран. 18 стран, т.е. более половины из ответивших на вопросник, выступают за принятие по инициативе ЕЭК ООН правила об использовании огней в дневное время (главным образом, ходовых огней) на всех четырехколесных транспортных средствах, и, кроме того, 11 из этих стран желают ввести соответствующее постоянное обязательство для водителя, а три страны выступают за введение соответствующего сезонного обязательства. Четыре страны отметили, что они отдают предпочтение правилу, предусматривающему автоматическое включение огней.

С другой стороны, в связи с изменениями, происшедшими на уровне Сообщества, уместно отметить, что после принятия Европейской комиссией упомянутого выше сообщения от 11 июля 2001 года, Совет "Внутренний рынок, потребители и туризм" принял 26 ноября 2001 года выводы, изложенные в документе TRANS/WP.1/2002/14, в которых он сделал оговорку о том, что требование о постоянном использовании дневных огней должно быть введено только после согласования в предварительном порядке технических условий, отметив, что Совет пока не выразил своего мнения по аспектам безопасности дорожного движения и энергопотребления.
