- 1. **Project title:** Improving national capacities of Central Asian countries to harmonize and implement an internationally applicable system of classification and sustainable management of energy and mineral resources
- 2. Expected timing / duration: October 2017 September 2019

3. Objective and brief summary of the project:

The aim of the project is to improve national capacities of Central Asian countries to harmonize and implement an internationally applicable system of classification and management of energy and mineral resources. UNECE has developed the United Nations Framework Classification for Resources (UNFC) for the sustainable management of national energy and mineral resource endowments. UNFC is an international best practice that provides the most efficient tool for resource management by identifying interrelations among the social, economic, technological and physical aspects of a resource base. Central Asian countries are well endowed with natural resources such as petroleum and minerals, as well as uranium and have a significant growth potential for renewable energies. The adoption and use of UNFC is expected to enable better management of natural resources with full considerations for social and environmental impacts. The objectives of the project will be achieved through the following activities:

- A1.1. Develop 5 assessment reports on the status of energy and mineral classification systems;
- A1.2. Organize one sub-regional workshop to validate the assessment reports and to develop policy recommendations for adoption of UNFC to countries' national regulatory framework;
- A2.1. Prepare 5 case studies on application of UNFC to energy and mineral resources (one per country); and
- A2.2. Organize a concluding workshop to discuss the case studies and follow-up actions to implement policy recommendation on application of the national UNFC systems.

4. Expected results of the project:

EA1. Improved national capacities to develop national system for classification and sustainable management of all energy and mineral resources based on the UNFC.

EA2. Improved knowledge and skill of national stakeholders to apply UNFC for energy and mineral resource projects.

5. Target group and beneficiaries of the project:

The beneficiary countries are the Central Asian economies: Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, and Uzbekistan. The project is targeted towards government policy-making organs such as the relevant ministries and institutions like the national geological surveys and universities and is expected to enable better management of natural resources.

6. Justification of project and its relationship to the programme of work:

The project is directly related to the Expected Accomplishment (c) "Strengthened implementation of ECE recommendations/ guidelines, best practices and other normative instruments for sustainable energy development" of the proposed Strategic Framework for the period of Subprogramme 5 "Sustainable Energy" of the UNECE Strategic Framework for the period 2016-2017 and 2018-2019. The Expert Group on Resource Classification (EGRC) is mandated by the UNECE Committee on Sustainable Energy to work on classification and management of energy and mineral resources. EGRC develops and maintains the United Nations Framework Classification for Resources (UNFC) as a tool for sustainable resource management. The activities of EGRC focus on the application of UNFC to energy resources, including oil and gas; mineral resources; renewable energy; nuclear fuel resources; injection projects for the geological storage of CO2; and anthropogenic resources such as secondary resources recycled from residues and wastes. One of the major activities is to facilitate the development of case studies on a voluntary and extrabudgetary basis, using the developed UNFC specifications and guidelines if any, to assess the suitability of applying UNFC and the development of capacity building programmes.
