Note by the secretariat

Summary

The Meeting of the Parties to the Convention on Environmental Impact Assessment in a Transboundary Context requested the Convention secretariat, in accordance with the financial rules of the United Nations, to monitor the expenditure of the Convention's funds and to prepare a report for the next session of the Meeting of the Parties, based on the information contained in biannual reports. This report covers the period from after the fifth session of the Meeting of the Parties, in June 2011, to the end of December 2011.

I. Introduction

1. This report sets out income, in-kind contributions and expenditure in the reporting period, as well as the balance in the Convention's trust fund at the end of the period. It also identifies any savings and overspend. The report addresses work under the Convention, including under its Protocol on Strategic Environmental Assessment. Details of income and expenditure are provided in the annex to this report.

II. Pledges and fund-raising

- 2. The pledges made at the fifth session of the Meeting of the Parties were insufficient to cover the core budget. The Parties were therefore also invited to come forward with further contributions, and the Meeting of the Parties: (a) encouraged Parties that had up till then not pledged anything to make contributions during the current and future budget cycles; and (b) Parties that had up till then only committed limited funds or in-kind contributions to raise their contributions during the current and future budget cycles.
- 3. Some Parties made unpledged contributions in the reporting period. No country was in arrears in payment of its pledged contribution.

III. Income and expenditure

- 4. Table 1 summarizes the income and expenditure in United States dollars. (Financial contributions to the Convention's trust fund are listed in tables A.1 and A.2, in annex.)
- 5. Some activities under the workplan² were assigned priorities 1 or 2 in the core budget; other activities, whether or not explicitly listed in the workplan, have been assigned priority 3. Pledged and non-earmarked contributions are only to be used to fund core budget activities with priority 1 or 2.
- 6. Some countries imposed conditions on their contributions, notably by earmarking them for priority-2 activities and especially to support participation in meetings by representatives of countries with economies in transition (CITs). Switzerland made funds available for technical advice to Uzbekistan, as foreseen in the workplan but not expected to be covered by the core budget (therefore assigned priority 3). Sweden and Switzerland provided funds for activities not listed in the workplan but implied in the declaration by the first session of the Meeting of the Parties to the Convention serving as the Meeting of the Parties to the Protocol; these activities have also been assigned priority 3. Switzerland made a contribution to cover practical costs of a side-event to the "Environment for Europe" Ministerial Conference, held in Astana in September 2011, whereas Sweden's contribution is intended to enable the secretariat to support the ratification of the Convention by the Russian Federation.
- 7. One priority-2 activity was not completed within the previous intersessional period and was therefore carried forward, together with its budgeted funds: a subregional cooperation workshop for the Mediterranean Sea.

8. The income, together with the funds for the carried-over activity, totalled \$352,789. Outstanding pledged contributions total \$374,970.

- 9. The secretariat spent from the trust fund in accordance with the budget (table A.3, with further details in tables A.5 and A.6). The funds were spent on a priority-1 external expert to provide secretariat support and on four priority-2 activities in the following areas:
 - (a) Two sessions of the Implementation Committee;
- (b) A meeting of the Chairs of the Bureaus of the ECE Conventions and of the Committee on Environmental Policy (as no fourth meeting of Bureau);
 - (c) Secretariat travel in relation to the workplan;
 - (d) The promotion of contacts with countries outside the region.
- 10. In addition, further to the earmarked contributions by Sweden and Switzerland, the secretariat spent from the trust fund on the side-event to the "Environment for Europe" Ministerial Conference and on supporting the ratification of the Convention by the Russian Federation.

- 11. The expenditure totalled \$118,351, to which was added 13 per cent United Nations programme support costs of \$15,386, leaving a balance in the trust fund of \$219,052.
- 12. Parties, other States and organizations also undertook three priority-3 workplan activities in the following areas by providing in-kind contributions (table A.7):
- (a) Financial support of a speaker at the side-event to the "Environment for Europe" Ministerial Conference;
- (b) A subregional cooperation meeting in Poland for the countries of the Baltic Sea area;
- (c) A four-day workshop to strengthen capacity for the development of EIA and SEA systems in Uzbekistan, with sharing of experiences from other countries in the implementation of the Espoo Convention and in particular its Protocol.
- 13. These activities, funded by in-kind contributions, have been valued at \$37,000 in total.

IV. Overspending and savings

- 14. There has been no overspend or savings to date.
- 15. Table 2 presents the budgetary requirements for the period between the fifth and sixth sessions of the Meeting of the Parties, identifying how much of the budget has been fulfilled by expenditure and in-kind contributions and taking into account savings and overspend. Table 2 refers to priority-1 and -2 activities as only these had a budgetary allocation.

V. Outstanding requirements and operating reserve

- 16. Table 2 also presents the outstanding budgetary requirements at the end of the period, totalling \$1,177,007 for priority-1 and -2 activities. These requirements may be contrasted with the available funds for such activities, totalling \$166,053, and the outstanding pledged contributions of \$374,970. **A substantial shortfall is therefore anticipated.**
- 17. An operating reserve of \$411,925 was created by carrying forward unspent funds from the two periods between the third and fourth, and the fourth and fifth sessions of the Meeting of the Parties, as decided by the Meeting of the Parties at the respective sessions. The operating reserve provided contingency funding to ensure continued operations under the Convention in the event of unanticipated problems, for example delayed receipt of contributions.
