RE: Case ACCC/C/2012/67 Denmark concerning the Compliance by Denmark with provisions of the Convention on Public Participation in the adaption of river basin management plans.

In letter of 8 October 2012 to Aarhus Convention Compliance Committee the Danish Nature Agency requested the Committee to exercise the discretion in paragraph 21 of the annex to decision I/7 not to consider the communication further at this point.

This request was based on the view that the communication was *inadmissible* because national Danish remedies had not been exhausted. At that point a large number of cases regarding the procurement of the Danish river basin management plans were pending before the Danish Nature and Environmental Board of Appeal (the Board) and the Danish Courts.

However, on 6 December 2012 the Board unanimously found that the supplemental public hearing, which lasted 8 days from Saturday 3 December 2011 to Saturday 10 December 2011 (both days included) and was carried out by the Danish Nature Agency, was <u>not</u> in accordance with section 30, first sentence and second sentence, of the Danish Act on Environmental Objectives (AEO) (in Danish "Miljømålsloven").

In that connection the Board stated that, the supplemental public hearing period was substantially to short taking into account the volume, content and complexity of the river management plans.

Evaluating the supplemental public hearing the Board involved Denmark's obligations under article 6 (3) (4) and (8) of The Aarhus Convention including experiences in this context regarding hearing periods (time-limits).

As a consequence of its findings the Board ruled that the adoption of all 23 Danish river basin management plans were invalid. The Board then remitted the plans to the Danish Nature Agency.

A copy of the Board's ruling on 6 December 2012 (in Danish) is annexed to this letter. If requested the Danish Nature Agency will translate the ruling into English.

The Danish Nature Agency will now thoroughly go over the Board's ruling examining its consequences.

As a result of this examination the Danish Nature Agency kindly asks for the Committee to suspend its consideration regarding the communication until the Committee's next meeting in March 2013.

Subsequently, the Danish Nature Agency will provide the Committee with a more detailed response regarding the ruling of the Board.
