Dear Fiona -

If it is possible to redact my National Insurance Number [number redacted] as well, which is included alongside my income details, I would be grateful. Black pen, rather than blue, appears to be most effective.

I understand the UK government's desire for more evidence to support the breaches of the Aarhus Convention that I have presented. I would be very willing to provide supportive documentation.

The housing association (Wirral Partnership Homes/Magenta Living) to build on the Bridge Court Area, West Kirby, has, within the last seven days, started depositing lorry loads of building materials within the boundary of the tree preservation area. Emails have been exchanged between myself (and other local residents opposed to the building works) and the housing association.

The housing association, having waited for the end of the six month application period, for appeals to be made to the ECtHR, has said that it intends to start building works. The housing association has been informed that an application has been made to the ECtHR, within the six month period, and that the ECtHR is yet to make a decision on the admissibility of the application. Whether building work does, in fact, commence is yet to be seen.

The housing association has also been informed that a decision concerning the admissibility of a communication to the A.C.C.C. is yet to be made.

Thank you, again for all that the Aarhus Convention Compliance Committee is doing to assist members of the public to protect and improve the environment.
