4.9 Other/overall comments on access and recreation proposals

- Access for disabled users:- How about using the old forest road for 'Radar Key' holders and making sure it is fit for wheelchair users. Some bench seating (made from forest wood) would be very welcome in the forest and across the Warren. Pedal cyclists should have their own routes through forest as they can be quite dangerous vehicles too especially to deaf and disabled
- Access improvement is a delicate matter if the natural qualities of the forest and the island are to be maintained. As has been said, increase access for motor vehicles and you destroy what you are attempting to conserve. There is a ??? Limit to the numbers the area can absorb without changing the whole character. Whilst not an elitist, I do feel that the people who want to find out about the area and are keen on knowing if ?????? lesson off their own bat - so there should be no artificial enticement by the creation of "attractions". The wall is attractive for what it is, not for what develops ????? might wish to make of it. This comment does not exclude improved access, under strict control for the disabled.
- Local people/residents to launch boats only. There are only a handful and they are all responsible and aware of taking care of the area. Ban all dogs on beach and Llanddwyn I have children who have found themselves in dogs mess. Disgusting
- I have used Newborough forest for recreation since I was eight (I am now 45) at least on a weekly basis. I was born and raised in Llangristiolus and my close relations still live in the Tredraeth/Bodorgan area. The tranquil nature of the forest has changed very little over this period, although more people now use the forest for dog walking etc - probably reflecting the high number of older people who have retired to the area over the last decade. I feel the present management of the forest is excellent and this questionnaire is asking the right questions.
- I would like access to the resident car park to be extended to families with young children
- Last question very interesting you let them film and park on beach, but we can't launch a boat what's the difference??
- Tide Tables are available, Sand Bank warnings, Dog notice Enforcement
- Is pandering to the general public more important than safeguarding the flora and fauna? Are humans getting their priorities right? Why is it not more generally recognised that even the extinction of a most obscure species is another 'nail in the coffin' of man himself? Every species of plant and animal plays an essential role in preserving the balance of nature, complex food chains and webs holding all life on Earth together and ensuring stability. So look after this precious site.
- A key for the bottom gate should be available to purchase for all local people, not only residents of Newborough. This would generate considerable revenue for the forest and still keep the gate locked.
- I think the beauty of Newborough lies in it's wealth of pure air and space - many developments suggested will lead to it becoming like many other areas (Benllech etc). I think it will lose it's uniqueness. Living in this wild area is a privilege in itself - eco friendly tourism means keeping this area UNIQUE.
- The residents car park should be open to disabled people and groups who are disabled. My father loves Ynys Llanddwyn. Since having a stroke he could not walk to there from the main car park. It is sad that only residents of Newborough can access the residents car park especially when some who live on the outskirts of Dwyran gain access for having a 440 number rather than 430 (Telephone)

- The main attraction of the forest and Warren is it's wildness - and in the main this draws people there are plenty of areas elsewhere where other activities can be followed - but very few where people can walk in safety - children can play in the forest and the water can be enjoyed without power boats or other dangerous craft.
- Tighter control of keys to prevent use by holiday lets - would prefer they paid full entry price to fund summer use.
- Kite surfers to have their own area, not to be mixed with bathers
- You have an outstanding area of natural beauty, it would be lovely to keep it that way, but more wardens are needed to maintain order and respect. Picnics are fine, with the removal of litter, but even then there are cases where individuals leave cans, bottles and cigarette ends, rather than clean up; BBQ's will add to the problem.
- On bank holiday weekends traffic and parking is awful, more spaces are required with better notification of capacity before entering lane to beach as it's hard to turn round if full.
- Mountain bike trails, family (easy) marked trail. Allowance for Husky and Sled Dog Race in the Forest during winter. Sculpture trail as in Forest of Dean and Brizedale - sculptures by local Artists.
- What about organising activity weeks for 10-17 year olds including survival skills, backpacking, orienteering etc and some watersports like kayaking.
- As a Council Tax payer £25 of my tax is paid to Rhosyr Council, what for? I don't mind paying the annual sum of £15 for our electronic key, but I very much resent the fact that newcomers to the area are given access to the residents car park. I suffer with Rheumatoid Arthritis so access to Llanddwyn Island is denied to me WHY? I think it's about time that the Forestry Commission tell the people of Newborough the Forest should have National access to allcomers, the coastline does not belong to Newborough, hoping against hope of getting a satisfactory outcome to the request.
- Present access is fine but I agree this could annoy local residents on busy days. Maybe another entrance could solve this?
- The area is renowned for it's beauty wildlife and peace and quiet. The forest area provides valuable recreational areas the beach is a safe family beach no Kite surfers or Kite buggies - windsurfers etc should have demonstration areas on the beach to protect young children and bathers! Again who checks the Kites have insurance?
- Thank you for your form asking me for my views on the development of the forest and dune field. I feel I should expand on my comments. Proposal 1. Does improving footpaths mean broad gravel paths? The existing network of paths is very extensive, and needs only a little brush and scrub clearance. Waymarking and mapping will give access to many superb features within the forest, without losing the charm of narrow sandy tracks through the forest. All ability access will need to be wheelchair compatible. Access to the dune fields is a difficult one to call. Human tracks causing dune mobilization by sand blows will cause opposition, but without the dunes shifting to smother the scrub willow and change the dune slack water table height, the specialist environment needed by the rarer plants and animals will be lost. Dunes are mobile environments, but without intervention will stabilize to be scrub and woodland. If the dunes are to be kept as dunes then human intervention is unavoidable, and people destabilizing the dunes is probably preferable to engineering machinery. Proposal 2. Guidance, education, policing, lifeguarding??? Wardens on site at weekend rates is costly, and can be an unwelcome intervention in a visit. Proposal 3. Horsebox parking is needed and needs to be on that side of the road, but may be by the forest road rather than by the cob. Proposal 4. Permanent orienteering courses (including Wayfaring and Bike 'O') would be a welcome addition; my experience in W Yorks and W Midlands, with Airienteers, EPOC and Harlequins indicates that if properly set up, they are well used and enjoyed. The main difficulty was ensuring maps were available and up to date, and that the control markers were not vandalised, which happened

regularly as other woodland users found them intrusive and an attraction to runners. Proposal 5. I would love to see a horse drawn "Taxi" service for tours around the site, with direct relevance for disabled access as well as for less fit visitors. Economic feasibility is the problem, with shelters, stabling, and operators required. Proposal 6. Proposal 7. The residents car park has no toilet facilities, and a steep (occasionally eroded to vertical) access to the beach. Access to the island for the low mobility disabled is quite a problem, and possibly needs across beach vehicular access (see P.5 for a poss. solution, publicized special equine access days might work). Proposal 8. I fully agree with the proposal.

- Whatever is taken on at Llanddwyn should only be done with the areas best interests as the main thing. The whole area is so natural and is as it stands the most outstanding place on Anglesey. Things can be done to improve the area but not if it defaces the Natural Beauty of the place.
- Kite surfers need to be controlled to protect young families bathing in the sea.
- Café/Restr. Cooked food using local produce (just come back from Scotland and boy are they geared up for tourist and locals alike).
- Access to the residents car park by permit key for organised groups - canoe trailers, young children (under supervision in a minibus) - allowing easier access to Llanddwyn Island and it's facilities
- Major concern horses which gallop
- Would like to know what the Beddgelert orienteering entails.
- Access for recreation, Education and training using kayaks should be planned for and encouraged. Kayak access required only a car park and footpath to a launch area. The quiet nature of the activity is harmonious with the natural environment. Mountain biking: whilst not a mountain biker, has any consideration been given to this activity - such as a designated trail. Camping: any chance of a secluded, limited facility, tent only site. Access to walking groups only? e.g. coastal path walkers D of E expedition groups, authority education centres. Kayaking Access: I would be very much in favour of improved access for organised kayaking groups e.g. local authority outdoor education centres, Plas Menai, North West Wales Outdoor Recreation Partnership (such as access to the residents car park).
- Being of pensionable age, my wife and I would agree to most proposals.
- Excellent ideas, especially disabled access via residents car park
- Pay & Display ticket on car windscreen - hourly rates etc. Open toilet block as per quantity of cars in car park. NEED - POST CARD of it all - 4/5 pics all on one.
- Llanddwyn Island is unique - its magic should be preserved and its isolation is part of this - I do accept though that disabled access is difficult at present. Overall I believe the priority should be preservation of the area as closely as possible as it is now - albeit with some development to assist the village to become more attractive and prosperous.
- Provision of metal dog waste bins on walls. Seats on walks for elderly and infirm. Logs would do. Refreshment retail outlet on large car park by beach run by you for profits. Coastal boat trips, licence fee to go to you.
- make a dedicated map of forest roads, There are already posts (with a number) at each road junction. \this would be for walkers and cyclists only
- for more info please contact [REDACTED], local resident, facility user & frequent visitor ma countryside management & conservation
- subtle management much better than an aggressive style e.g. deciding some species of tree are in and others are out - same with all aspects of management - take in the very long term - do not destroy to make for greater access - small can work!

- 4) BBQ area = No unless there are park wardens on site designated area. This in my opinion would be misused. 6) I agree - unless quad bike (one) for a beach warden. The wildlife needs to be protected including the wild flowers etc
- the area is large enough to accommodate every one. Come on get with the plot! And more with the times
- keep the forest simple so people can enjoy peaceful walks to observe the wildlife. Do not make it into a leisure park or cycling park as in Coed y Brenin (Dolgellau)
- a lot of visitors are very rude and pay no heed - they ride bicycle down footpaths - do not stick to the routes - one drove up the back of the car while I was coming through and came behind so the didn't have to pay - in a large new 4x4 - I then drove at 2 miles an hour so they couldn't pass me! people like ??? used to drive around instead of advertising and pay more staff - sadly they have got away with it. should be a lovely place to ride bicycles walk on marked trails. This year bicycles seem ??? the footpaths 2 abreast
- cycle routes would be excellent
- as residents of Llangeinwen only 1/2 mile outside Newborough boundary, we are denied access to the residents car park. As OAP's with some walking difficulties it is too far to walk from the main car park to Llanddwyn Island. Hence the NO as we're not yet disabled but feel entitled to a residents key as we pay Rhosyr community council tax
- who will monitor bbq area? Who will prevent drinkers from becoming a nuisance to other users? A large number of people walk dogs, take children after work, will it be safe with drunk people in the forest? This is a very bad idea! What about increased risk of fire?
- along the A4080 road from Newborough towards Malltraeth about 1 mile from Newborough there is a stile on the left with access to the forest. There is a footpath sign beside this stile. For some years this footpath has been unusable due to flooding - the whole path is a river - in some parts too deep to use even with wellies on especially after rain
- local people should be allowed to launch fishing boats and leisure boats. Wildlife in the area has deteriorated drastically since the planting of the forest. Prior to forestry there were numerous terns, lapwings seagulls and crows.
- I personally think that the forest has been disturbed and a lot of it removed already. There is no need to remove any more of this beautiful location in order to please other people. People have managed to use the forest as it is for years and can still manage now
- more litter bins & dog waste bins in residents car park, and a more regular emptying of bins in main car park
- emergency point for notifying of personal or environmental problems, or simply " I think you should know"
- this beach will be ruined and robbed of its unique tranquility. It will become like every other beach instead of maintaining its serene ambience for which is its attraction for better class people
- there is too much motorised traffic within the forest now please don't increase it
- there are already too many vehicles with access to the forest through locked gates to which residents have no entry, these locks should be changed and access only to authorities and emergency services, sometimes it is dangerous to walk with cars/vans travelling on forest roads
- my husband and I both agree there should be a beach patrol/lifeguard at all times due to recent events (accidents loss of life last year etc)
- how should the access to a key for all groups to enter forest area now not accessible to transport e.g. Oriel Rhosyr Arts Group which meets at the PJ Hall weekly

- please minimise any extension of vehicular access or commercialisation
- create a more adventure routes, encourage horse riding and off road biking, make paths interesting use colour coding to enable families to follow green paths easy blue paths intermediate red advanced
- I think the residents car park near the island should remain just for the residents
- disabled access to the beach should be in the main car park where the toilet facilities are
- the main benefit, would be signed paths
- paths should be cleared for the summer months to attract more walkers
- dogs continue to be a problem as 50% of dog owners ignore signs and continue to use all areas of the beach, including Llanddwyn Island could you please consider using signs and marking designated beach areas more clear for dog owners and more intervention from both the beach warden and warden on Llanddwyn Island
- it seems all this is being sympathetically undertaken and I suppose it largely depends on finance
- nothing should be done to spoil the natural setting increased access will make too much of an impact and make the environment look 'managed' by men
- fantastic family cycling area - both on tracks & a purpose built easy mountain bike/rack. In our opinion this would be an excellent resource & mountain bike skills area. Designated area kite/buggy/kite surfing activities - is the residents car park really necessary - as on a busy day cars are on the main track
- specific family friendly bike tracks needed (circular route) café in car park - preferably run by/owned by a local person or group to promote the area and sell local produce
- exclude water scooters from the bay
- Perhaps color coded walks denoting length, duration these walks could be either at ones choice (individual) or organised via warden and maybe a merit (badge) awarded on completion, the badge would also have an advertising benefit nationally
- footpaths are fine as they are 'improvements' could spoil wildness of forest. Likewise with facilities for the disabled - to make reserve more accessible to all would spoil wildness - I envisage metalled paths everywhere instead of sand
- proposals to open up a recipe to destroy the essential nature of the warren and plantations
- provide wheelchair access as far as beach while keeping path too narrow for vehicle access. In view of it being a blue flag beach, how can there not be disabled access on to the beach
- PLEASE do not let Newborough forest/warren become too commercialised. Many of us walk there for peace and quiet supposed to be an area of outstanding NATURAL beauty
- The use of vehicles owned or provided as a service for the disabled and hard for workers to gain access to the Island
- Risk management vital where increased numbers proposed/encouraged. How might wardens operate, relate to business of FC & management CMTE/group?
- I'd like to see an extension of biking facilities as that would mean that people could in future cycle all the way from Llangyllog down the cefni over to Llanddwyn. I've had a number of punctures along the forestry track which puts me off doing it again - even though I'd love to! One small tarmaced area or very fine gravel 'lane' would be wonderful and be a big boast to tourism in the area
- I think Newborough should be accessible to all but it's beauty and uniqueness should be maintained and it is not necessary to develop of it as a commercial prospect in ANY way

- 1) Extend key scheme (for car access) to Malltraeth residents. This seems reasonable to me as the forest/land extends through to Malltraeth. 2) Some residents see it as Malltraeth Forest! 3) Perhaps a multi-level fee, depending on where you live. 4) All ability/access is, I think an ideal situation, however, in reality there are some areas where it is just not possible without major refurbishment - at considerable expense! Who pays for this and at what cost to the land. I think we have to accept that wheelchair access is not really feasible here, in any major way.
- If more people and vehicles are encouraged to come into and use the area, the forest and the environment must be protected from fire, vandalism, litter, damage etc. Certain species of wildlife already under pressure maybe driven out of their habitat. Therefore extra wardening and provision of LITTER BINS which are emptied regularly would be required
- many users use the paths for exercising antisocial dogs. One path at least should be for dogs on leads only
- It is all well and good restricting vehicular access and prohibiting the use of fires, however these restrictions are flaunted on a daily basis. Evidence of fires within the forest and on the beach can be seen daily. Fireworks are regularly used in the forest car park, picnic benches have been set alight by BBQ's
- I agree that it is a good idea to increase accessibility and improve facilities within the forest especially if the local economy benefits
- When first visiting Newborough as a tourist the beach attracted me as it was completely unspoilt with no gaudy cafes, ice cream vans etc, for many years this has remained the same. As a resident I was delighted to see it the same. This years addition of a mobile cafe was very disappointing and won't help the one recently opened in the village. Children need somewhere with no pester power facilities and my children remember the beach as totally unspoilt and undemanding
- if some/all proposals are implemented there would be an immediate need for numerous staff - how would these be financed or would you hope for enough volunteers. Local village residents do not have a very reliable record even for paid employment
- some paths need better management to try and prevent erosion more permanent structures may help. Mountain biking needs management, designated tracks with maps etc (see marine trail Betws y Coed. Or manage use of bikes better! Kite surfers designate an area/create access to Malltraeth side where less people walk, CHARGE FOR USE, put toilets etc for these people

- We would like any development to be minimal and to relate to the meaning of "recreation" in a positive sense - I.e to enjoy the area for its own sake rather than to engage in active leisure pursuits e.g biking, surfing, boating etc. So that the facilities are unspoilt, and the nature of the area is retained - i.e to try and keep it as close to its natural state, while allowing the public - including disabled - to gain access to all feasible parts of the site.
- The unspoilt nature of the area must be protected.

- No obligation to some improvements for disabled access but certainly no more motor vehicles. We would prefer to see the area. Managed to the absolute best of its potential for wildlife - inc. red squirrels. Please don't be pressurised into thinking that it has to be an amenity.
- At the moment it is very easy to get lost on a walk round the forest, which can make it an enjoyable adventure, but can also be very distressing for some people. Colour coded signing or strategic posts would be an advantage, so people could decide what length of route to take.
- Family orienteering - open to be miss used by a few - damage plants - wildlife etc. Litter (glass) left in forest- fire hazard - area is so vast - how can it be controlled?? Need more wardens for the vast area to be properly supervised.
- Community buy shares in forest? Plant and tree/fell trees for firewood - sublet small plots for own use (restrictions) Lottery bid (people and places). Involve community to manage economic/recreational business. Ensure its self sustaining- possibility to generate some income.
- What is the Beddgelert Orienteering Scheme?
- Apart from fine tuning and local improvement to current facilities- must remember prime function of the forest warren I.e nature conservation with well defined area.
- Link roads to residential car park - should be resurfaced.
- Hold annual angling competitions and charge a small fee to enter and have some sort of vehicle and trailer to transport the disabled, to visit Llanddwyn from September onwards
- We have had a number of experiences with horses riders - riding round blind corners and footpaths at a reckless speed, they need suitable rules and be made to observe them.

During the summer months this is evident as you walk the forest by the litter and plastic bags of dog mess they expect to miraculously disappear from where ever they dump them. Personally I find Newborough Warren to be a boring place to walk, saved only by fantastic view!
- The remoteness and uncommercial atmosphere is the beauty of the area and must not be spoiled by having too many recreational or public facilities
- Access good, recreation good, why change and commercialise
- If by the 'residents (sic) car park' you mean the small car park at the Llanddwyn Island end of Newborough beach, how does one obtain access to this car park? What are the necessary qualifications to allow use of a key to the barrier? Why not offer this facility as a payable extra to those who would not otherwise qualify? This would generate more income for forest enterprise
- One of the best things about the warren & Newborough forest is that they still feel relatively wild & unspoilt. The aim should be to retain this virtue. Management should be very sensitive and restrained. Too many facilities could spoil the place
- Pony and carts will greatly increase large vehicles accessing the car parks, should be separate car park and pre-bookable

- The site should be left as natural as possible - no more buildings or ?????? Hotels. Dog waste bins should be provided at beach entrance not further back in car park. Dogs (on leads) should be allowed to cross from residents car park and on Llanddwyn island all year. A dog under control can do no more harm than a human
- My comments above look very antisocial! However I have lived in the area for 30 years and observed visitors of all types becoming increasingly reliant on cars not feet. If they could all park on the beach. Buck the trend like the national trust and by limiting car parks to further away, people walk, they enjoy then appreciate and respect

5.5 Overall/other comments on involvement and partnership proposals

- Training and career development initiatives: what does this mean? Where is it leading? Not to a commercial ventures free-for-all within forest/beach/warren I hope. Perhaps Coleg Menai could do development of ecological and visitor management skills. I thought F.C.W. did certain similar training? One could have bodgers and carvers working with the wood from the forest, in the forest; products sold through local outlets.
- Strongly agree with last point. The handling of the previous proposal to clear the forest and re-establish duneland was a classic example of disastrous P.R. Management.
- More info through local newspapers etc
- Ok in principal, but activity levels to be kept low.
- Only if this is done in a way which protects the site from exploitation in any form.
- Education, Training and jobs for local indigenous people to own the responsibility for the area. Co-ordination between the groups essential-wasted opportunities in the past.
- It is good to have honest and representative consultation. The conservationists should be heard if you are to keep the special nature of Newborough. Developments within the village (park and ride from main village) is preferable to extending shoreline car parks and more beneficial to beach / residents.
- I wouldn't like any more limitations on where I can walk
- Build holiday cottage complex owned and run by local teenagers. Shares issued to all teenage residents, divided yearly on profits this would involve teenagers, provide some jobs and discourage vandalism in the area. Woodland Lodge Complex.

- Educational involvement is never a bad proposal.

- The Forest is a National site and the management should bear in mind this is not just a "Newborough" issue re SSSI and AONB
 - involve young locals that are 'bored' to keep site clean and act as guides if needed and teach them about wildlife and the wonderful outdoors collect litter
 - Pilots cove - canoes my professional opinion is that pilots cove would not be a suitable storage location for canoes/kayaks. Introductory activities are best done in the sheltered waters eg Llyn Padarn(the lagoons). I have led numerous trips from the beach car park to pilots cove and around Llanddwyn island with youngsters. A dynamic risk management process is required to do this successfully. A pro-active decision to use Ynys Llanddwyn is necessary - with consideration given to 'the group' environmental factors (weather tide and sea state) the nature of the activity and with kayaking around Llanddwyn with youngsters provides a fantastic experience but it should not be taken lightly. Storing kayaks at Pilots cove has the potential to introduce inflexibility of approach in a potentially hazardous location. Please feel free to contact me for discussion or advice regarding this proposal

 - Keep pilots, love as it is. Create a boat store close to car park(people taking part in watersports will have kit to carry, need access to changing /toilets) - for disabled access too. Great idea, wrong place.
 - Forest and environment becoming far too commercialised and destroying natural areas.
 - I suppose canoes could be stored at Pilotcove, but the amount of water boats and yachts/dinghy traffic in summer can make the cove congested and stinking of fuel, and be unpleasant and even dangerous for swimmers.
 - t is the teenage population in Newborough that need significant attention. To stop them hanging around the village shop.
 - This has already been discussed and there was public outrage. There is a village in wales which already has a wood processing and heating/hot water system in place and they do not feel any disadvantages.
