Dear Ms. Gomez,

You may recall that through decision IV/9f, the Meeting of the Parties to the Aarhus Convention invited Spain to carry out a study with regard to injunctive relief in environmental cases, award of legal aid to environmental NGOs, and the rule of dual representation. The decision also also invited Spain to report on the progress with respect to: (a) the fees by public authorities for provision of information relating to urban planning and building to ensure that such fees are the same as for information relating to the environment; and (b) the time frames applicable in public participation according to the Spanish laws.

I would like to thank you for the update you provided to the Committee on 12 June 2013, with regard to the studies on access to justice currently underway.

According to the decision, Spain is expected to report on the progress achieved by December 2013.

However, the Committee at its next meeting (24-27 September 2013) will already consider its recommendations to the Meeting of the Parties at its fifth session. For this reason, we would appreciate if you could share with the Committee, through the

secretariat, any information you might have with respect to:

- a) Access to information: the fees by public authorities for provision of information relating to urban planning and building to ensure that such fees are the same as for information relating to the environment;
- b) Public participation: the time frames applicable in public participation according to the Spanish laws
- c) Access to justice (if possible to share with the Committee the preliminary draft/outcomes of the ongoing study, in Spanish, if not available in English yet)

Having considered the information, the Committee will share with you its draft recommendations to the Meeting of the Parties. You will then have the opportunity to comment to these recommendations along with your final report expected in December

2013. The Committee will adopt its recommendations in December 2013.
