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Legal Framework

- Law on Social Protection of Children without Parental Care, Article 9
- Law on Social Assistance, Article 12
- Law on Social Security of Servicemen and their Family Members, Article 34
- Law on Allocating Apartments Built for the Refugees Forcibly Displaced from the Republic of Azerbaijan in 1988–1992 with Ownership Right
- Law on Repressed Persons, Article 6
 - Other legal acts enforcing the aforementioned laws.

PROGRAMMES WITHING THE COMPETENCE OF THE RA MLSA

- Registration of persons (families) in need of (eligable for) housing, 2000
- Granting credits to 275 out of 300 registered families of repressed persons, 2001
- Providing housing for 310 out of 390 registered orphanage graduates and children without parental care, 2006

HOUSING PROVISION PROGRAMES IN THE CONTEX OF REFORMS

- Integrated social services system
- Providing appropriate package of social services based on needs
- Housing as one of social services
- RA Government Decree N1009-N, 02.08.2012
- RA Government Decree N894-N 01.08.2013.

SOCIALLY VULNERABLE AND SPECIAL GROUPS

- Persons who have been considered as children without parental care
- Orphanage graduates
- Families who have got more than "0" points for their general work skills records
- Single employed or unemployed pensioners
- Single-parent families if one of the spouses has died or if the child has been adopted by a single person
- Supporting families, the members of which are under 18

Distributing the number of social dwelling houses based on social groups

- Persons belonging to one social group not more than 50%
- Priorities:
- Children without parental care or orphanage graduates
- Single-parent household
- Single pensioner
- Supporting family

Registration and Provision

- General work skills registration
- Online access to the necessary data
- Rejection in case of having a living space with ownership right and if is incapable of self-service
- The apartment has been alienated during the previous 5 years
- Introduction to the procedures of record keeping, putting on the waitlist, granting the dwelling, as well as to residents' rights and liabilities

Supporting Family

- SF proposal within a one month period
- Resident of the given community
- Two-parent family with children
- ► Not having family ties to the other residents (families) of the social house
- One of the adult family members shall earn an income
- Heathy moral and psychological relationship in the family

Drawing up the Waitlist

- In accordance with the date of application, place of residence (community) and the social group
- The same person (family) can be included in different social groups at the same time
- Priorities: the community, region, marz and the country
- In case of equal data, priorities will be considered
- The number of children
- Availability of disabled family members of groups I and II
- > One of the family members is a soldier

Removal from the Register

In the events of

- Accommodation in a dwelling (in case of different social groups, too)
- Acquiring an apartment
- Grounds set are no more in effect
- Moving abroad from the RA
- Application on removal from the register
- Written refusal of the dwelling (to be allocated) for the second time
- Submitting unreliable data
- Death of the applicant

Providing a Dwelling

- In case of availability of free dwelling
- Double check of the availability or absence of grounds for removal from the register by local social service agencies
- The citizen is informed on the requirement to conclude an agreement
- In the event of non-attendance the local social service agency tries to find out the reasons or draws up a written refusal

Terms for Providing a Dwelling

- Perpetual for those who have reached the social security's retirement age
- A 10-year term for supporting families and children without parental care (orphanage graduates)
- The 5-year agreement may be prolonged with 5 more years if the ground for record keeping has been maintained
- On a contractual basis after the expiry date

Rights of the Resident

- To freely reside in the dwelling including with family - parent, spouse, children, siblings or other relatives based on an appropriate argument
- To host relatives for up to a 3-month period
- ▶ To be absent for a 6-9 month period
- To get other social services

Liabilities of the Resident

- ▶ To appear in the SNCO within a 30-day period
- ▶ To register at the State Register of Population within a 7-day period
- To pay utility fees in a timely manner
- Follow the general rules of cohabitation in social houses

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
