Brief summary of Global Survey completion process: The process was carried out in cooperation with the Ministry of Human Rights and Refugees of Bosnia and Herzegovina (MHRR) as the main national coordination body. On 12/09/2012 MHRR addressed officially the questionnaires by mail or fax to 43 ministries and other administrative bodies responsible for specific areas from the chapters of the PoA, taking into account the structure of Bosnia and Herzegovina and division of comptences between Bosnia and Herzegovina (state), Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina (entity), Republika Srpska (entity) and Brcko District (district). The Ministry of Economic Relations and Regional Cooperation of Republika Srpska demanded in official correspondence addressed to the MHRR to coordinate the process of completion of questionnaires in this entity in line with its competences to coordinate and follow up all the activities of institutions of Republika Srpska related to cooperation with international organizations and institutions.

A total of 35 filled in questionnaires were returned. A late reply and missing information on the primary respondent prevented the MHRR and coordinator to request additional or missing information from the form. In the case of Republika Srpska, there is an indication of the institution, which completed the questionnaire, but the additional contact information refer to the contact person of the Ministry of Economic Relations and Regional Cooperation of Republika Srpska.

Bosnia and Herzegovina is a complex structure, consisted of two entities: Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina and Republika Srpska, and Brcko District of Bosnia and Herzegovina, which is an administrative unit of local self-governance under the sovereignty of Bosnia and Herzegovina. This complex structure of Bosnia and Herzegovina and joint competence over the issues from the PoA is reflected in the completed questionnaires. With the exception of the Section IV: International Migration and Development, which is fully under the competence of Bosnia and Herzegovina, all the other issues are under the shared competence of Bosnia and Herzegovina, two entities and Brcko District.

The information from the questionnaire was used for the preparation of the country report: ICPD beyond 2014, which was presented at two workshops held on 17/10 and 16/11/2012 in Sarajevo and was subject of three rounds of

consultations between the institutions by e-mail. The processes of consultations were coordinated by the MHRR.
