the reports)	National programme "Youth information and counselling centres" (2007-2010) was designed to meet the needs of young people by raising awareness on key aspects of their daily lives, involvement in solving the social problems that affect their lives, improve access to information and youth services, especially in smaller settlements; acquisition of skills for expression of creative and professional potential. Emphasis in the program is building a sustainable partnership between the local community - young people, local authorities and civil society. The main objectives of the program are related to increasing the motivation of young people for their own development, the development of the society in which they live and their realization and participation in public life; support the implementation of youth communities and adaptability to European values and standards through non-formal education and training, and developing the capacity of organizations to provide youth services. The target group of the NP "YICC" (2007 - 2010) are children and young people aged 14 to 35 years, youth organizations and structures.
	National program "Youth Information and counseling centers" (2007-2010) (YICC) has submitted the opportunity for continuous upgrading of services to the target group, generating new ideas and different campaigns and initiatives for and with young people. Average one Youth information and consulting centre has covered a large number of youth between 2007-2010 in four main areas:
	• Information services - 11,449 young people;
	• Consultings - 2,179 young people;
	Trainings - 497 young people
	Initiatives and campaigns - 10,271 young people
	The most used are information services in the areas of non-formal education, volunteering, youth employment, the environment and health. The focus on demand for consulting services is non-formal education, participation in civic initiatives, volunteering, development and implementation of youth projects. Young people are most interested in teamwork trainings, preparation of youth projects and interaction between young people and local authorities. The most attractive were the initiatives and campaigns of YICC in the field of creativity, civic participation and social inclusion and environmental protection. Many of the information and counselling services are available via Internet. Promotion of services under the program is implemented through initiatives and campaigns, meetings in schools, as well as project partners - local authorities and businesses. According to the results of a study to assess the youth program in 2011, 94% of young people, regardless of age and gender, consider that services are accessible to all youth. Greatest access to these

	 National AIDS campaigns and activities in health promotion and prevention of HIV / AIDS and sexually transmitted infections are conducted annually by 28 regional health inspections (RHI) and achieved the following results: 1033 carried informative events and campaign activities among

young people;

- distributed 255,760 condoms;
- 245,603 common health educational materials;
- total of 312,691 campaigners, 26,829 of them trained on issues related to HIV / AIDS and the promotion of sexual and reproductive health.
- There is a network of 19 offices for a free and confidential counseling and testing for HIV (VCT Centers) in the country, supported by 12 mobile medical teams. Over 130,917 of people were tested for HIV, of which 62% are young people aged 16-29
- There was built through 'peer education' an International Center for Training and Research Peer Education Training and Research Institute (PETRI Sofia), part of the international Y-PEER network.
- Ministry of Health (MoH), Ministry of Education, Youth and Science (MEYS) and The United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) are in charge of implementing a joint project "Improving sexual and reproductive health of young people in Bulgaria". One of the main objectives of the project is to improve educational opportunities for young people aged between 10 and 24 years to build knowledge, skills and attitudes for responsible sexual behavior. The project is implemented in four areas Lovech, Vratsa, Sliven, Targovishte, which registered the highest number of unintended pregnancies among girls aged 15-24 years, prevalence of sexually transmitted infections and the high rate of abortions in this age. As a result of the project, completed in late 2009:
- Nearly 1,500 young people attend classes on sexual and reproductive health within the project;
- Each of the 25 schools in the project is equipped with a DVD player, TV and computer;
- There are four modern educational information centres for reproductive health at Regional Inspectorates for the Preservation and Control of Public Health (RIPCPH);
- In 25 schools there are funded small school projects on issues of sexual and reproductive health, and relationships between young people, which reaches nearly 10 thousand youths.
- Through small school projects each year, nearly 15,000 young people in the four municipalities are involved in programs to prevent risky sexual behavior.
- Regional Inspectorates for the Preservation and Control of Public Health in the pilot municipalities carried out four educational information campaigns to raise awareness among young people about the available health services and services within the pilot municipalities.
- Over 100 GPs and obstetricians from the pilot communities participated in the seminar on "Sexual and reproductive health of young people and sexually transmitted infections."
- There are provided modern contraceptives (condoms, IUDs and hormonal
