The Danish society is characterized by a universal approach to welfare aimed at providing equal opportunities for all citizens. The Danish welfare system is based on a platform of sound government finances, high employment rates and a well-functioning labour market combined with an efficient and well-operating public sector.

It is important to underline that the Act on Social Service (Serviceloven) regulates, in a comprehensive way, benefits in cash or benefits in kind vis-à-vis older persons, persons with disabilities and children and young people who for a broad variety of reasons are in need of assistance.

Thus, the objects of the Act are:

- to offer counselling and support so as to prevent social problems;
- to offer a number of general services designed to serve as preventive measures at the same time; and
- to satisfy needs resulting from impaired physical or mental function or special social problems.

This is done with the purpose of improving the capability of the individual recipient to be self-reliant, or to facilitate his/her daily life and enhance the quality of life.

All benefits provided for in this piece of legislation are financed by public taxes and are granted in accordance with a concrete assessment of the individual needs of the person concerned. The social services are carried out by the 98 municipalities throughout Denmark ensuring that the service is carried out as close to the citizen as possible.

On this background the term "project" in the questionnaire is as a general rule not relevant in a Danish context where the right of the individual is derived directly from binding legislation.

On 21 June 2009, the Act on Greenland Self-Government (Self-Government Act) came into force. The self-government arrangement for Greenland thereby replaced the Greenland Home Rule Arrangement that was established in 1979.

In the preamble to the Self-Government Act, it is recognised that the people of Greenland are a people with right to self-determination under international law. Accordingly, the Act is based on an agreement between the Greenland Government and the Danish Government as equal partners.

At the request of the Greenland Home Government, Denmark in 1997 ratified ILO Convention No. 169 concerning Indigenous and Tribal Peoples in Independent Countries. This Convention applies to the indigenous people of Greenland. By ratifying the Convention the Danish Government declared that the Home Rule Act for Greenland fulfilled the obligations of the Convention.

The Greenlandic (and the Faroese) people are Danish citizens. Danish citizens moving from Greenland to Denmark have in general the same rights and obligations as other Danish citizens and vice versa.

A small part of Greenlanders living in Denmark is socially vulnerable. This part may have complex problems in terms of addictions, homelessness and psychological difficulties. Besides these social problems, they may face linguistic and cultural challenges and have a lack of knowledge on the organization of the Danish system. Therefore, the Government and the majority of the Parliament have put forward a strategy which strengthens the effort towards vulnerable Greenlanders and their children.

Additionally, when staying in Denmark, Greenlanders are covered by the Act on Social Service in all aspects (2.12).

Thus, the more specific questions will not be pertinent in a Danish context.

The Danish system supports that a successful family policy can provide families with a freedom to arrange their own lives. Most Danish families can and want to take responsibility for themselves. The role of the society is to give the families freedom of choice. Society provides good framework conditions but it is the responsibility of the individual family to create a good family life.

The public sector creates the societal framework for families with children and the objective is to provide children and young people with optimum conditions during childhood and adolescence and to protect them against ill-treatment and neglect. The public sector provides guidance and support to parents on how to exercise their parental responsibilities.

The various social protection schemes are implemented locally by the 98 municipalities and, to some extent. The municipalities have a vast degree of autonomy in their choice of policy measures and the organisation of services to be provided.

Support to families with children is granted by way of services allocated on the principle that anyone in need should have equal rights to the services and by way of financial assistance to all families with children or assistance in special cases.
