Finland has, for a long time, tried to settle the rights of the Sámi to the regions traditionally used by them in a manner acceptable to all parties, but without success. The objective has been to reach a balanced solution that would comply with Finland's international obligations and ensure that not only the Sámi but also the other inhabitants can influence the way the use of their living areas is arranged. However, the question has proved to be very complex and difficult.

The Finnish Government, appointed after the parliamentary elections of 2007, was committed to ensuring the right of the Sámi to maintain and develop their language and culture based on their self-government prescribed by the Constitution. There were negotiations within the Government on a framework for further legislative work concerning the development of the indigenous rights of the Sámi. The aim was to examine whether the proposals made in the course of the years be used as a basis for administering state-owned land areas in the Sámi Homeland and for supporting traditional sources of Sámi livelihood, or whether different approach is necessary.

The intention to ratify the International Labour Organisation's Convention 169 concerning Indigenous and Tribal Peoples during the sitting Government's term of office has been included in the Programme of this Government, appointed after the parliamentary election of 2011. Finland's National Human Rights Action Plan 2012 - 2013 includes projects that seek to improve the rights of the Sámi by clarifying legislation on their right to participate in policymaking and planning concerning the use of State-owned lands and waters in their homeland. The complexity of the issue has had its influence on this work, too; the work has not yet completed.

Regarding land rights, the new Mining Act and Water Act were adopted in March 2011. Both of these laws prohibit measures that impair the opportunities of the Sámi as an indigenous people to engage in their culture and related traditional livelihoods. They also include provisions on hearing the Sámi Parliament, and on the right of the Sámi Parliament to appeal against decisions made pursuant to these laws.
