UNRSF in summary



Established in April 2018 as a UN Multi-Donor Trust Fund, with the strong support of the UNSG, UNECE/ES, Special Envoy, and UN GA's welcome.

"The Fund was created to finance actions in low- and middleincome countries to a) substantially reduce death and injuries from road crashes, and b) reduce economic losses resulting from these crashes."

Vision: to build a world where roads are safe for every road user, everywhere.

Mission: finance - and leverage further funding for - high-impact projects based on established and internationally recognized best practices that increase road safety and minimize and eventually eliminate road crash trauma for all road users.

Make cities and human settlements inclusive, safe, resilient and sustainable.

TARGET 11.2

By 2030 provide access to safe, affordable, accessible and sustainable transport systems for all, improving road safety, notably by expanding public transport, with special attention to the needs of those in vulnerable situations, women, children, persons with disabilities and older persons.

TARGET 3.6

By 2020 halve the number of global deaths and injuries from road traffic accidents.



- Ensuring oversight and accountability.




Achievements in 2019



FUNDING CRITERIA AND PRIORITIES

Three priority areas



Technical assistance in support of establishing, improving and/or sustaining comprehensive National Road Safety Systems (NRSS) in low- and middle-income countries step by step

Priority 1

Gaps identification and creation of a national action plan with support of GFPA

Priority 2a

National action plan (or similar) in place – specific technical assistance to deliver an action with a system solution to improving NRSS

Priority 2b

Specific technological or educational solution to improving NRSS

Priority 3

Specific technical assistance to deliver a system solution to road safety management
