## NEW PROPOSALS FOR AMENDMENTS TO RID/ADR/ADN

## Chapter 3.3: New special provision for cleaning pads containing environmentally hazardous substances

## Transmitted by the European Council of Chemical Manufacturers'Federation (CEFIC) */

## 1. Background

Due to the new classification criteria in 2.2.9.1.10, some cleaning agents became dangerous goods (class 9, UN 3077 or 3082). This also applies to cleaning pads.

## 2. Justification

According to special provision 216, assigned to UN 3175, cleaning pads containing flammable liquids (packing group II or III) are not subject to RID/ADR/ADN if the prerequisites are met. Therefore a similar special provision should be introduced for cleaning pads containing environmentally hazardous substances (liquid or solid), as these are, compared with flammable liquids, even less dangerous.

## 3. Proposal

Introduction of a new special provision (similar to SP 216) for solid materials soaked with environmentally hazardous substances, liquid or solid to exempt these materials from RID/ADR/ADN, as long as the requirements laid down are met.

[^0]3.3.1 Add a new special provision $6 x x$ (for UN numbers 3077 and 3082) with the following wording:
"6xx Sealed packets containing less than 10 ml or g of a liquid or solid environmentally hazardous substance absorbed into a solid material are not subject to RID/ADR/ADN provided there is no free liquid or free solid in the packet."
