Annex 1, section E, sub-section II, paragraph 14

Paragraph 14 should be corrected to read as follows:

"Sign E, **18** "EMERGENCY STOPPING PLACE" indicates a place which shall only be used by drivers for stopping or parking in case of emergency or danger. If this stopping

place is equipped with an emergency telephone and/or an extinguisher, the sign shall bear the symbols F, 17 and/or F, 18 either in its lower part or on a rectangular panel placed below the sign. This sign has two models, E, 18^{a} and E, 18^{b} ."

Annex 1, section F, sub-section I, subparagraph 2

The end of subparagraph 2 should be corrected to read as follows:

"2.... The symbol shall be black or dark blue, except symbols F, 1^{a} , F, 1^{b} , F, 1^{c} and F, **18**, which shall be red. The symbol F, **17** may be red."

For "F, 14 'EMERGENCY TELEPHONE'"
"F, 15 'EXTINGUISHER'"
read: "F, 17 'EMERGENCY TELEPHONE'"
"F, 18 'EXTINGUISHER'"
