





The 1ST Stage:

- 1.250 m pier with 20 m sea depth
- 15 ha storage/stacking area by the sea + 950 ha in Dry ports
- Entrance-Exit Complex
- Loading- Unloading Station for Railcars
- Reloading Equipment Quay, Storage/Stacking and Railway Terminal
- Supportive Activities (Service, Office Premises, Parking Areas)










DRY PORTS AND INTERMODAL TRAFFIC NETWORK FOR TRANSLOADING AT 75 TEU/h


















CROATIAN INLAND NAVIGABLE ROUTES AND RAIL CONNECTION TO RIJEKA PORT

Szczecin Declaration on the Central European Transport Corridor CETC-ROUTE65 – Supporting the European regional development

We, the Ministers of Transport of the Czech Republic, the Kingdom of Sweden, the Republic of Croatia, the Republic of Hungary, the Republic of Poland and the Republic of Slovakia joining the process of the ongoing discussions on the sustainable future of transport in Europe:

- EXPRESSING THE POLITICAL WILL to create the shortest transport link in Central Europe on the North-South axis enabling uninterrupted transit of people and goods between Northern and Southern Europe;
- HAVING IN MIND the need to increase the transport accessibility level of the regions along the Corridor;
- RECOGNIZING transport as one of the key factors stimulating further European integration and macroeconomic stability;;
- AIMING AT the establishment of a coherent and integrated transport system in Europe including priorities of individual regions and countries in terms of economic development;
- RECOGNIZING the need for the use of modern technologies and for basing the development of transport on the principle of co-modality;
- WILLING to contribute to the reduction of the negative impact of transport on the environment through the development and implementation of the green corridors concept;

declare that we will:

- strengthen the CETC-ROUTE65 cohesion with the European transport system;
- promote joint initiatives and projects aiming at enhancement of economic development in all the CETC-ROUTE65 regions;
- promote on international fora the development of CETC-ROUTE65 in accordance with the concept of green corridors.
