


Africa's Resource Endowment: Selected Countries

....but what do we normally see?


Population below poverty line (%)



Africa's vision for capacity building in resource management



Capacity Building refers to ***the process aiming to facilitate, in conjunction with the stakeholders, a consolidation of their capacities at an individual, organisational and sectoral level to allow them to evolve and adapt to the new contextual requirements and fulfil their role within a governance structure.***

AMREC Approach

1. Defining competent persons requirements to bring confidence in decision-making and operations
2. Promotion of professional bodies with enforceable code of ethics
3. Promotion of Pan African Resources & Reserves Reporting Code (PARC)
4. Establishment of an AMREC secretariat under AUC (AMDC) to promote trainings
5. Emphasis on National Content
