## **Question from the Compliance Committee to the parties**

Please clarify for <u>each</u> of subparagraphs (a)-(g) of paragraph 2 of the First Transitional Provision of the Spanish IPPC Law (translated in English on pages 3-4 of the communication and set out below), which specific provision of the Industrial Emissions Directive each subparagraph is intended to implement:

- "2. According to paragraph 1, permits shall be considered updated when they contain specific prescriptions on:
- a. Incidents and accidents, especially regarding the obligations operators have of communicating them to the competent authority and of implementing measures, even complementary ones, to limit environmental consequences and avoid other possible incidents and accidents;
- b. The failure to comply with permit conditions;
- c. In case of waste generation, the implementation of the waste hierarchy as established in article 4.1.b);
- d. When necessary, the report mentioned in article 12.1.f), which must be taken into consideration in the event of plant closure;
- e. The measures which will be applied in the event of anomalous functioning conditions;
- f. When necessary, the monitoring requirements for soil and groundwater;
- g. In the case of incineration or co-incineration plant:
  - i. Waste treated by the plant, when listed in the European Waste List
  - ii. The emission limit values regulated for these types of plants."
