**Re: Request for reconsideration of determination of inadmissibility of
communication ACCC/C/2019/171 (Albania)**

I write to inform you that on 3 July 2020 the Chair and Vice-Chairs of the Aarhus Convention Compliance Committee considered your request of 24 June 2020 that the Committee reconsider its determination at its sixty-fifth meeting (Geneva, 4-8 November 2019) that the above communication was inadmissible.
