BACKGROUND

The United Nations Economic Commission for Europe (UNECE) will hold its 68th session under the theme “Smart sustainable cities: Drivers for Sustainable Development” on 9 – 10 April 2019 at the Palais des Nations in Geneva, Switzerland. To inform the intergovernmental discussions of the 56 UNECE member States, the Commission is preceded by a **Day of Cities** that brings together **Mayors and Deputy Mayors** for an exchange of views and knowledge sharing of good practices and successful planning strategies. In two roundtables, Mayors and Deputy Mayors will discuss approaches on how to create smart sustainable cities, focusing on ways to improve the quality of life of people and on improving efficiency of urban operations, services and competitiveness.

The Day of Cities also provides an opportunity to learn more about UNECE instruments that support sustainable practices and ways to monitor progress on the path towards creating a smart sustainable city.

An exhibition and information fair invites participants to showcase their success stories, and present useful tools that help to embrace smart and sustainable practices.
