Biennial evaluation plan for 2014-2015 on the housing and land management component of the Housing, Land Management and Population subprogramme

Summary

This note describes the biennial evaluation plan for 2014-2015. It includes the expected accomplishments and indicators of achievement for each activity cluster presented in the programme of work. These expected accomplishments and indicators of achievement have been amended from the previous biennium to reflect better the planned activities.
