# What is GBA+?


✦ It is an analytical process to assess proactively how diverse groups of women, men and gender-diverse people may experience government initiatives

✦ The “plus” in GBA+ considers multiple intersecting factors

- race, ethnicity, religion, age, and mental or physical disability

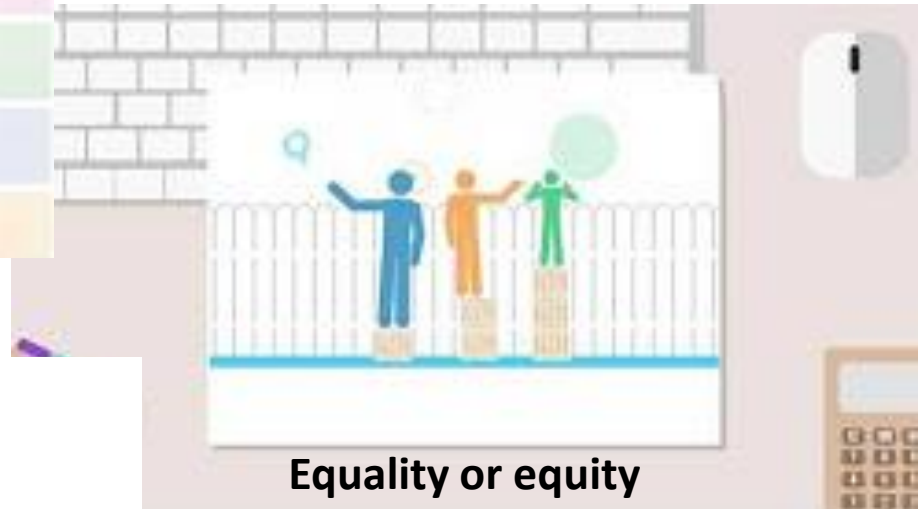
