#### A. WP.29 session

#### ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA

Following the provisions of Chapter V, Rule 13 of its Rules of Procedure (TRANS/WP.29/690), WP.29 will elect its Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson(s), who shall take office at the one-hundred-and-twenty-ninth session, in March 2003.

#### COORDINATION AND ORGANIZATION OF WORK

- 3.1. The Chairman of the Administrative Committee for the Coordination of Work (WP.29/AC.2) will report on the discussions held during its eightieth session and submit its proposals for consideration by WP.29.

- 6.1. The secretariat will present an updated list of the Contracting Parties to the Agreement.
- WP.29 may wish to review the progress of of work of its subsidiary Working Parties, with a view to the implementation of the programme of work concerning the 1998 Agreement (TRANS/WP.29/841, paras. 109 to 112 and annex 4). Distributed are also the reference documents concerning the guidelines for the proposing and developing global technical regulations (TRANS/WP.29/882) and their format (TRANS/WP.29/883).
- 6.3. WP.29 may wish to consider any modification to the priorities in developing global technical regulations, if recommended by AC.3.

#### 7. 1997 AGREEMENT (INSPECTIONS)

7.1. The secretariat will present an updated list of the Contracting Parties to the Agreement.

In this regard, WP.29 may wish to re-open the question of the opinion of the EU regarding the competence with respect to the Agreement and its application by the EU Member States (TRANS/WP.29/861, para. 120).

Consideration of any other items related to the 1997 Agreement is being postponed by the secretariat, because no working document has been received from the International Motor Vehicle Inspection Committee (CITA) before the official deadline for the preparation of working documents for the session (see TRANS/WP.29/841, paras. 116 and 117).

### 8. 1971 EUROPEAN AGREEMENT SUPPLEMENTING THE 1968 CONVENTION ON ROAD TRAFFIC

WP.29 is invited to consider the amended definitions of moped and motorcycle, proposed by the Working Party on Road Traffic Safety (WP.1), and amended by GRSG at its eighty-second session (TRANS/WP.29/GRSG/61, para. 47). If endorsed and transmitted to WP.1, the implications of these modified definitions should be considered for the Consolidated Resolution on the Construction of Vehicles (R.E.3), annex 7 (document TRANS/WP.29/78/Amend.2).

#### 9. OTHER BUSINESS

WP.29 agreed to continue its consideration of the ways for improving the enforcement of type approval and conformity of production standards. This should include consideration of reflections concerning informal document No. 8 that had been submitted by the Russian Federation during the one-hundred-and-twenty-sixth session. The delegates are kindly requested to bring their copies of this informal document for reference (TRANS/WP.29/861, para. 121).

- 9.1.1. WP.29 is expected to consider a concise summary of an original ISO document, for using it as guidance for the preparation of regulations (TRANS/WP.29/861, para. 122).
- 9.1.2. WP.29 is expected to consider possibilities for assisting the resolution of interpretation issues, on the basis of a proposal by France (TRANS/WP.29/861, para. 123).
- 9.1.3. The comparison and study of recall systems applied for motor vehicles in various countries may continue, if any additional information was made available (TRANS/WP.29/861, paras. 124-128).
- 9.1.4. WP.29 might wish to continue its consideration of the feasibility of establishing an electronic database for type approval exchange of information, following the example of the system functioning in Australia (TRANS/WP.29/861, paras. 129 and 130).
- 9.2. WP.29 agreed to consider a joint proposal by OICA and CLEPA concerning the replacement parts and resolving the question raised by OICA in document TRANS/WP.29/2002/27 (TRANS/WP.29/861, para. 131).
- 9.3. WP.29 will be informed of the personal changes in the delegation of Japan.

#### 8. ADOPTION OF THE REPORT

In accordance with established practice, WP.29 will adopt the report on its one-hundred-and-twenty-eighth session on the basis of the draft prepared by the secretariat.

#### B. Sessions of the Administrative/Executive Committees

#### 1. 1958 AGREEMENT - TWENTY-SECOND SESSION OF AC.1

#### 1.1. ESTABLISHMENT OF THE AC.1

The Administrative Committee shall be composed of all the Contracting Parties in accordance with the rules of procedure set out in Appendix 1 of the 1958 Agreement (E/ECE/324-E/ECE/TRANS/505/Rev.2, Article 1, para. 2).

#### 1.2. DRAFT AMENDMENTS TO EXISTING REGULATIONS - VOTING BY AC.1

Amendments to Regulations shall be established by the Administrative Committee according to the procedure indicated in Appendix 1. Proposed amendments to Regulations shall be put to the vote. Each country, Contracting Party to the Agreement applying the Regulation, shall have one vote. A quorum of not less than half of the Contracting Parties applying the Regulation is required for the purposes of taking decisions. For the determination of the quorum, regional economic integration organizations, being Contracting Parties to the Agreement, vote with the number of votes of their Member States. The representative of a regional economic integration organization may deliver the votes of those of its constituent sovereign countries, which apply the Regulation. Draft amendments to Regulations shall be established by a two-thirds majority of those present and voting (Article 12 and Appendix 1).

Contracting Parties experiencing difficulties in attending the sessions of the Administrative Committee AC.1 might be allowed exceptionally to express their views on items considered in writing, or by delegation of their voting power to other Contracting Parties attending the session (TRANS/WP.29/482, para. 11).

If all Contracting Parties to the Agreement agree, any Regulation adopted under the terms of the unamended Agreement may be treated as though it was a Regulation adopted under the terms of the amended Agreement (Article 15, para. 3).

#### 1.4. NEW DRAFT REGULATIONS - VOTING BY AC.1

The Contracting Parties shall establish, through an Administrative Committee made up of all the Contracting Parties in conformity with the rules of procedure set out in Appendix 1 and on the basis of the following articles and paragraphs, Regulations for wheeled vehicles, equipment and parts which can be fitted and/or be used on wheeled vehicles (Article 1, para. 1).

Proposed new Regulations shall be put to the vote. Each country, Contracting Party to the Agreement, shall have one vote. A quorum consisting of not less than one-half of the Contracting Parties to the Agreement is required for the purpose of taking decisions. For the determination of the quorum, regional economic integration organizations, being Contracting Parties to the Agreement, vote with the number of votes of their Member States. The representative of a regional economic integration organization may deliver the votes of its constituent sovereign countries. New Draft Regulations shall be established by a two-thirds majority of those present and voting (Appendix 1, Article 5).

#### 1998 AGREEMENT - SIXTH SESSION OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE AC.3

- 2.1. OPEN MEETING
- 2.1.1. AC.3 may wish to review the progress of work by the Working Parties on the proposals for candidate global technical regulations.
- 2.1.2. During its fourth session, in March 2002, AC.3 agreed to assess if any change should be considered for the priorities in developing proposals for global technical regulations (TRANS/WP.29/841, paras. 165, 166 and annex 4).
- 2.1.3. Consideration of any other issues, as appropriate.

#### 2.1. CLOSED MEETING

- 2.1.1. The Contracting Parties to the Agreement are expected to resume consideration of the questions related to the operation and implementation of the Agreement.
- 2.2.2. AC.3 might wish to consider any actions by the Contracting Parties, with a view to achieving effective functions of the Agreement.
