**PROPOSALS OF AMENDMENTS TO THE RECOMMENDATIONS

Provisions concerning radioactive material

Harmonization of the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) Regulations for the Safe
Transport of Radioactive Material

Transmitted by the expert from the United Kingdom

1. At the twenty-ninth session of the UN Sub-Committee of Experts on the Transport of Dangerous Goods, the expert from the United Kingdom presented ST/SG/AC.10/C.3/2006/53 which contained proposals to harmonize the text for Class 7 both in the UN Model Regulations and the IAEA Regulations. With the adoption of the proposals both in this document and INF.40 from WNTI, the expert from the United Kingdom realises that consequential amendments are required against four Class 7 numbers, UN 2908, UN 2909, UN 2910 and UN 2911 in the Dangerous Goods List which cover excepted packages.
2. In the space for columns 8-11 which cover packaging and tank provisions the reference to Chapter 2.7 needs to be replaced with Chapter 1.5 as the requirements are now referenced here. Therefore the words "See Chapter 2.7" should be replaced by "See Chapter 1.5".

3. Finally during a review of the final text prepared by the Secretariat, the United Kingdom noticed that in the new text for 4.1.9.1.1, new indent “(a) Excepted Package” is referenced. However there are no packing requirements relating to Excepted Packaging in Part 4 of the Model Regulations and the expert from the United Kingdom suggests that the text is amended as follows:

“(a) Excepted package (see 1.5.1.5)”
