2. AETR Agreement

(a) Activities of interest to the Working Party

The Working Party will be informed about the results of sessions of the Inland Transport Committee, its subsidiary bodies and other United Nations entities of interest to the Working Party. In particular, the secretariat will provide an update on the key decisions of the seventy-seventh session of the Inland Transport Committee.

(b) The Memorandum of Understanding which recognizes the Joint Research Centre as the authority responsible for Root and Interoperability Certification for non-EU AETR Contracting Parties

The Working Party may wish to discuss whether to extend the Memorandum of Understanding which recognizes the Joint Research Centre as the authority responsible for Root and Interoperability Certification for non-EU AETR Contracting Parties. The Memorandum expires on 30 June 2015.

(c) Proposed amendment to Article 14 of the AETR

At the 109th session of SC.1, the Working Party adopted an amendment proposal to Article 14 of the AETR Agreement to allow Algeria, Jordan, Morocco and Tunisia to accede to it. The secretariat will inform the Working Party about recent developments on this proposal.

(d) Digital tachographs: Costs of installation and maintenance

The cost of installing and maintaining digital tachographs has been raised at previous sessions of the AETR Group of Experts. The Working Party may wish to consider sharing information on this subject.

3. Proposal for a global multilateral agreement on the international regular transport of passengers by coach and bus (OmniBUS)

At the last 109th session of SC.1, the Government of Switzerland was invited to assess – as far as possible - the comments provided by the secretariat with the aim of developing another draft for consideration at this session of SC.1.Informal document No. 1 contains the most recent revisions from the Government of Switzerland. The Working Party will continue discussing the text of a draft Omnibus agreement.
