2. Programme of Work: Taking Stock of National Legislation

The Group of Experts may wish to review its programme of work, specifically taking stock of the existing national legislation with the aim to describe and assess the degree of implementation of the 1968 Convention on Road Signs and Signals. The Group of Experts will be invited to discuss the information collected via the web-based Road Signs Management System. In this context, experts will be invited to analyze the signs submitted in the "Convention category" (starting from the E, 17 a sign) by using the methodology agreed upon at the second session, i.e. sign-by-sign assessment focusing on deviation identification and description, deviation evaluation, recommendations and assignment of "in-conformity indicators" for both images and definitions. The experts of Denmark, Finland, France, Kuwait, Luxembourg and Portugal, and, those who have not presented their preliminary analysis at the seventh session, will be invited to do so for the signs E, 17 to G, 24c as agreed previously.

The Group will be also invited to discuss the signs from A, 20 to A, 21 b, A, 28 a through A, 29 c and from E, 9 to E, 11 as well as to continue its discussions started at the sixth session on the evaluation of the non-Convention signs and related observations presented by the secretariat (ECE/TRANS/WP.1/GE.2/2016/1). The Group was also requested to design a new symbol of gates (A, 25) as well as to propose a sign for breaking gates in case of being trapped at a level crossing. A symbol denoting that parking is available with an option to change to other transport means (park and ride) should also be discussed.
