- B.1. AMENDMENTS TO ECE REGULATIONS
- B.1.1. <u>Regulation No. 14</u> (Safety-belt anchorages)

GRSP agreed to consider an updated proposal for effective anchorages by Spain, if available. GRSP may wish to consider a new proposal by Japan for the introduction of mandatory equipment of three-point safety-belt in the rear outboard seats of N1 vehicles.

B.1.2. Regulation No. 16 (Safety-belts)

GRSP agreed to resume consideration of the proposal by Spain and OICA for extending the drivers' maximum chest displacement to other occupants of the vehicle. GRSP may wish to consider a new proposal by Japan, which aligns to the proposal for Regulation No. 14.

B.1.3. <u>Regulation No. 17</u> (Strength of seats)

> GRSP agreed to resume consideration of new updated proposals by Spain, by the Czech Republic, and by CLEPA, if available.

B.1.4. <u>Regulation No. 21</u> (Interior fittings)

> GRSP agreed to retain the proposal by the United States of America for further consideration awaiting the final data from the United States of America concerning the free motion headform and new test procedures from EEVC.
