> GRSP agreed to continue consideration of the proposals by Switzerland about hearing damage caused by airbags, taking into consideration the study by France. GRSP may also wish to consider the reports of research programmes on airbags by the United Kingdom, United States of America, Germany, and ISO, if available

- AMENDMENTS TO ECE REGULATIONS 2.
- 2.1. Regulation No. 14 (Safety-belt anchorages)

GRSP agreed to consider a proposal by France for an "ISOFIX" system with two lower anchorages only and a TRANS/WP.29/GRSP/1997/11 proposal by Spain for a new definition of an effective anchorage. GRSP also agreed to continue consideration of the proposal by OICA for a draft global technical regulation.

2.2. Regulation No. 16 (Safety-belts)

GRSP agreed to continue consideration of the proposal by Japan.

2.3. Regulation No. 17 (Strength of seats)

> GRSP agreed to resume consideration of an updated proposal by Spain, if available, and of a draft corrigendum by Italy. It was also agreed to continue consideration of the proposal by the United Kingdom, if new data were available.

2.4. Regulation No. 21 (Interior fittings)

> GRSP may wish to consider a proposal by the drafting group in charge of simplifying the Regulation, if available.

> GRSP agreed to continue consideration of the proposals by the Czech Republic, by the Russian Federation, and by Germany to modify the scope of the Regulation. GRSP may also wish to consider a new proposal by the United Kingdom for vehicles with a gross mass above 7.0 tonnes

GRSP agreed to consider a proposal by France to introduce the AISOFIX A system. It was also agreed to continue consideration of the proposals by Sweden, Spain, and Japan. In addition, GRSP may wish to consider a proposal by the Netherlands

2.7. Regulation No. 94 (Frontal collision protection)

> GRSP agreed to continue consideration of the proposals by Consumers International and by OICA, if available. GRSP may also wish to consider the proposal by Italy, aligning the prescriptions of the Regulation to those of the corresponding European Community Directive.

2.8. Regulation No. 95 (Lateral protection collision)

> GRSP agreed to consider a proposal by EEVC concerning the barrier design, if available.

- 3. OTHER BUSINESS
- 3.1. Exchange of information on national and international requirements on passive safety

GRSP might wish to exchange views on the development of national legislation, and on the development of international requirements, including draft global technical regulations.
