Statistical Capacity Development

process through which NSOs and NSS strengthen and maintain the capabilities to set, achieve and reinforce their institutional framework as well as their capacity to develop, produce and disseminate statistics over time

SDGs and beyond



Investing in National Statistical System and National Statistical Office (coordination role)

Modernisation, Innovation

Increasing demand of soft skills

→ institutional, planning, communication, users, etc.



Identification of needs and priorities
Resources available



Partnership and cooperation

Long term project → tailored capacity support with a country-led focus

Coordination of initiatives (mapping who is doing what and whereand how)

Sharing good practices → country to countries but also across countries



Timeline:

In February 2016, the CES Bureau set up a Steering Group on statistics for SDGs (ECE/CES/BUR/2016/FEB/5), with the following objectives: (a) to prepare a road map for developing official statistics for SDGs under CES.

In December 2017 Steering Group meeting, member countries agreed that there is strong need to improve coordination on SDG statistical capacity development within the UNECE CES region. To meet this challenge, establishment of the Task Team on Capacity Development was proposed.

In 2018/2020 MATRIX ON CAPACITY DEVELOPMENT was created

During 2022/2023 Task Team will pilot it, connect and involve the Capacity Development Matrix within newest capacity development international initiatives and define the final structure of the Matrix

Strategic pillar

- It is the enabling pillar within NSIs and their NSS (People and organization) function and can strengthen their statistical capacity. It includes:
- Institutional (legal framework- and revision of statistical law-, Professional Independence of NSI, mandal data collection, access to administrative data, confidentiality, etc)
- Internal Governance (of NSI) and overall governance of the National statistical system
- Coordination role
- Leadership
- Relations with other National Authorities belonging to the National Statistical System
- Communication with policy makers, stakeholders and users
- Profiling the needs of users
- Management and implementation of quality
- National Strategy on data and statistics (eg. NSDS)
- Partnership (with whom and to what)
- Coordination of cooperation initiatives

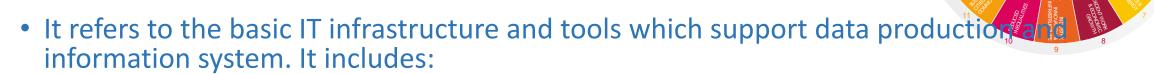


Organisational pillar

- It refers to the internal structure, processes, sectorial production which influence the effective research a system and allow greater and potential growing statistical capacity. It includes:
- modernization of statistical production
- human resources management
- IT infrastructure
- responsibility for SDGs
- organization of domains
- data sharing
- re-use data



IT pillar



- sdmx
- exchange of data
- metadata infrastructure
- standard methods
- standards
- data portal
- hardware and software

The vertical division consists of four main aspends on which specific questions are identified:

Level of development	What is your level of development?	Low/Medium/High
Presence of a Strategy document	Do you have a Strategy document that covers this area?	Yes/No
Need of external support	Do you need external support to further develop this area?	Yes/No
Priorities	What are the top priorities?	one or more priorities which you would like to implement in near future
