**Project title and project number:** Enhancing transparency and traceability for more sustainable value chains in the garment and footwear sector – Phase II

**Expected timing/ duration:** January 2023 - June 2024

Objective and brief summary of the project: The objective of the project is to enhance the transparency and traceability along the garment and footwear value chain, as part of improving the due diligence process by private sector actors, to advance more responsible production and consumption patterns in line with the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development. This project is part of a wider EU action and is jointly implemented in partnership with the International Labour Organisation (ILO), the International Trade Centre (ITC) and the International Finance Corporation (IFC). The EU action aims at improving working conditions and advancing sustainable production patterns in the garment and footwear value chains. It will do so through the achievement of two specific objectives: (i) to improve compliance with international labour and environmental standards in the garment and footwear value chains; (ii) to enhance transparency and traceability along the garment and footwear value chains, as part of improving the due diligence process by private sector actors. Following the successful implementation of the first phase of the EU action (from June 2019 to December 2022), Phase II will undertake additional activities under the project, to contribute to the output: "Development of dedicated engagement strategies in priority countries for the garment and footwear industry, with the setting up of industry consortia for the uptake of the UNECE Traceability & Transparency Toolbox and the development of Key Performance Indicators (TT KPIs) to measure the level of traceability and transparency of sustainable products and materials":

- A1.1. Establish engagement plans for public and private industry actors in 20 priority countries to advance traceability and transparency of sustainable and circular value chains in the sector, including on gender considerations;
- A1.2. Develop and adopt Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) to measure the level of traceability and transparency of products and materials for public and private industry actors in priority countries for the sector;
- A1.3. Organize 2 multi-stakeholder policy dialogue meetings for peer learning and sharing of lessons learned from the implementation of the UNECE traceability and transparency approaches and tools;
- A2.1. Conduct the integrated implementation of the UNECE and ITC traceability, transparency and audit convergence approaches and tools with industry consortia of up to 100 companies/industry actors and their supply chain partners for industry-wide scaling-up.

#### **Expected results of the project:**

EA1. Capacity of countries and companies to take risk-informed decisions and operate along a set of internationally agreed practices that increase the traceability and transparency of value chains, vis-a-vis all actors including workers and final consumers, is strengthened;

EA2. Connectivity and capacity to source more sustainably of retailers, brands and manufacturers along the value chain in the garment and footwear sector is enhanced.

#### Target group and beneficiaries of the project:

Target groups include government officials from Ministries of Trade, Economic Development, Environment and Labour, businesses in the garment and footwear industry, experts from International Organisations, NGOs and academia working on sustainable value chains in the garment and footwear industry. Beneficiary countries are the UNECE member States, and other countries for the sector in other regions of the world.

#### Justification of project and its relationship to the programme of work:

This project will directly contribute to the objectives: (a) "improve environmental governance and performance for safeguarding the environment and health" of the Subprogramme 1 Environment, and (b) "strengthen trade facilitation and electronic business, regulatory cooperation and standardization policies, agricultural quality standards and trade-related economic cooperation in the ECE region and beyond" of the Subprogramme 6 Trade, of the ECE Proposed Programme Budget for 2023. The project responds to the mandates set in the UN/CEFACT Programme of Work of 2023-2024 (ECE/TRADE/C/CEFACT/2022/21/Rev.1) adopted by the EXCOM at its 125th meeting (ECE/EC/2022/6), as well as in the Report of the 28th session of the UN/CEFACT Plenary (ECE/TRADE/C/CEFACT/2022/2) (Decisions 22-18 and 19).
