## Item 1. Approval of Draft Agenda

<u>Documentation</u>: Draft Agenda for Bureau Meeting on 27 April 2023

1. The draft agenda was approved. It was noted that Matthias Hartung and Sigurd Heiberg had been invited specifically for Agenda Item 3 "Proposal to establish a UNFC Adoption Standards Group".

### Item 2. EGRM-14

## (a) Bureau Elections

- 2. The secretariat read out the list of nominations for the positions of Chair and Vice-Chair as at 26 April 2023. All nominations were noted and all non-member State nominations were approved for submission to EGRM under the Election of Officers agenda item to be taken on 28 April.
- 3. The Chair advised that if elected as Vice-Chair, he would offer his full support to the incoming Chair and ensure a comprehensive handover.
- 4. Discussion proceeded over the role of Vice-Chairs. The only point raised was the need to study the precedents regarding the role of the Vice-Chairs.
- 5. The TAG Co-Chair proposed that as there are two nominations for Chair, Bureau Co-Chairs should be considered. He advised that he would propose this at the start of the Chair elections on 28 April.
- 6. The Chair advised that, to his knowledge, there are no precedents on having Co-Chairs of groups of experts and that this may not be suitable for the functioning of the Bureau. Other members raised if there would be Co-Chairs what then is the role of the Vice-Chairs. The Russian Federation supported the proposal for Co-Chairs and indicated it would support this if proposed at EGRM-14 on 28 April.

7. The two nominated candidates for the position of Chair, Ms. Karen Hanghoj and Mr. Igor Shpurov, advised that if they are not elected, they would like to be added to the slate of nominees for Vice-Chair

# Item 3. Proposal to Establish a UNFC Adoption Standards Group

- 10. Matthias Hartung and Sigurd Heiberg presented the proposal to establish a UNFC Adoption Standards Group. They discussed the significant achievements reached by EGRM on UNFC and underlined how its adoption is spreading within geological surveys, authorities, and academia, leading to general momentum outside EGRM. UNFC is seen as a reporting tool but not necessarily as a decision-making tool. They noted the importance of connecting with the green transition, the digital transition, and concerning the utilisation of data. The urgency in supporting legislation and industry standards was restated, with climate change and critical resource management being core to these issues.
- 11. The proposal to establish a UNFC Adoption Standards Group (ASG) would need to address the challenges to adoption challenges with urgency. This would build on the work undertaken on standards, guidelines, bridging documents, etc. The Group would leverage the expertise of EGRM to ensure sure that the adoption standards are developed with the needed expertise.
- 12. The Group would also provide an analysis on the gaps to the adoption of UNFC: Communication to decision makers to prepare them for the use of UNFC as a decision-making tool; Barriers to adoption: (a) on standards more needs to be done; (b) legislation to mandate UNFC adoption; (c) address other challenges; alliances are needed to bridge existing standards in global/national resource management, for example reach out to the ISSB. It was discussed that there needs to be a solution provided and then a proposal developed for consideration by EGRM to fill in the gaps to adoption with urgency and as a priority.
- 13. The discussions laid out the possibility to start with the ToR for the Group in May, together with invitations to potential members and the establishment of a functioning Group of 10-12 people. The Group, once established, would start consultations and deliver an analysis and focused solutions in 2023. Bureau members discussed these issues further, highlighting the need to use past work to ensure that good decision-making is based on the best information. The Chair supported the proposals and invited the Bureau members to show their support or otherwise for them through a display of hands. The show of hands demonstrated Bureau support in favour of the proposals.
- 14. The representative of Kazakhstan discussed the merits of establishing a UNFC Adoption Standards Group and shared his concerns and doubts. He raised concerns with the proposal for the development of standards to be adopted by all countries within EGRM. He and others raised doubts on data repositories, given that each state has its own standards. Another doubt raised was the risk of lobbying on behalf of private companies and the need for the proposed Group to go through TAG approval first.
- 15. The Chair underlined how engaging with experts from industry in the work of EGRM is something that has always been done and that, to his knowledge, there has never been any violation of

UN rules and protocols, and no strategic alliances have been developed with companies. The Chair further mentioned how the standards develop by UNECE are available for adoption by all interested parties. He also addressed concerns raised around enforcing data standards on countries and assured that that would never be proposed. The Chair clarified that the proposal presented needs to be modified to take all the points raised into consideration, including to consider modifying the name of the Group to remove Standards. The Chair requested that the language of the proposal be clarified prior to presentation to EGRM-14 to prevent possible misunderstandings. This was supported by other Bureau members.

- 16. The Co-Chair of the Technical Advisory Group (TAG) noted that he believes the procedure has not been followed and that the proposal by the Commercial Applications Working Group, to establish a UNFC Adoptions Standard Group, should have first been discussed and approved by the Technical Advisory Group before being presented to the Expert Group. He advised that a meeting of the TAG was held earlier that week at which the issue was raised. There was consensus amongst the TAG members present at the meeting that procedure had not been followed with the proposal and that it should have first been discussed by TAG before coming to the Bureau. A number of Bureau members raised that any proposal can be presented directly to the Bureau and then the Bureau can recommend or not whether a proposal is submitted to the Expert Group for consideration.
- 17. A number of Bureau members asked where the new UNFC Adoption Standards Group should best lie within the organisational structure, i.e., under the Bureau or the Technical Advisory Group.
- 18. The representative of Kazakhstan proposed to create a financial reporting working group for UNFC and UNRMS in order to achieve financial reporting in parallel with standards for the countries that have already adopted UNFC and UNRMS. The Chair welcomed the suggestion and expressed that the UNFC Adoption Standards Group would be the ideal place to discuss this but added that elaborating specifics for a financial reporting group was beyond the scope of what the Bureau could be ready to propose to the Expert Group on 28 April.
- 19. Following discussion, there was consensus in the Bureau to move forward with the proposal to establish a UNFC Adoption Standards Group and submit it to the Expert Group on Resource Management on 28 April for consideration. Given the cross-cutting nature of the Group, there was also consensus for the UNFC Adoptions Standards Group to report to the Bureau with the option to move the Group elsewhere if needed and/or requested by EGRM. The Chair requested the Bureau members to first allow the Expert Group to lead the debate on the UNFC Adoption Standards Group proposal and the appropriate organisational structure for it.
