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

Status of International Conventions and Agreements Affecting Inland Navigation

Note by the secretariat

I. Mandate

- 1. This document is submitted in line with the proposed Programme Budget for 2023, part V, Regional cooperation for development, section 20, Economic Development in Europe, Programme 17, Economic Development in Europe (A/77/6 (Sect. 20), table 20.6).
- 2. The secretariat reproduces below an updated table on the current status of legal instruments and ministerial declarations on inland navigation questions, adopted both within and outside the Economic Commission for Europe (ECE), as well as the progress in a number of their Contracting Parties since the pan-European Conference on Inland Water Transport (13–14 September 2006, Bucharest).
- 3. The Working Party on Inland Water Transport (SC.3) may wish to take note of the status of the legal instruments and decide on possible ways to proceed with those which have not yet entered into force or have a limited number of Contracting Parties. SC.3 may also wish to note that:
