





Why are provincial GDP data important in South Africa?




- There is a strong policy interest in economic growth in different parts of the country, for provincial policy formulation and evaluation
- Provincial institutions are interested to see how they rank against their peers and the extent to which their economies contribute to the country as a whole
- Provincial information helps private investors make better investment decisions
- Provincial GDP estimates are used as one of the indicators for equitable allocation of funds across South African provinces
- Provincial data enhances the existing body of economic and econometric models

Stats SA publishes sub-national economic data for selected releases and reports




However, there are still data gaps that we are trying to close; hence the estimation of regional GDP

Estimating provincial GDP figures



- Top down approach
- Provincial GDP estimates are compiled from the distribution of industry totals from supply and use tables (SUT) across provinces using provincial indicators
- Provincial indicators, derived from various sources, were used as distribution keys
- Data gaps were filled through extrapolation and interpolation with available data
- The provincial estimates were balanced and adjusted to maintain consistency with national totals





Volume estimates



- A double deflation technique was used to compile volume estimates at constant prices
- Output and intermediate consumption were deflated separately using relevant price indices




Key results





There are notable differences in contribution of regions to the GDP of South Africa


Percentage contribution to South African GDP in 2022, current prices (Total: R6,6 trillion)







Growth varied considerably across the regions










Regional GDP growth rates (2013–2022)


Annual percentage change in GDP Constant 2015 prices








Eastern Cape is the only province whose GDP per capita was higher in 2022 than in 2013

Index 2013=100 COVID-19 had a severe impact on GDP per capita in all provinces












Provincial industry composition in 2022


The largest industries in each province. Percentage contribution to provincial value added, current prices
















